She knew he was a Hebrew baby and sent the servant to get someone to care for him. The servant got the baby's real mother to look after him. Get a walnut shell, cotton wool, playdough, a bit of fabric:

Suddenly he saw flames leaping from a bush. Then he heard a voice calling, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob. I have seen the suffering of my people in Egypt, and have heard their prayers. It is time to rescue them from Egypt and give them the promised land of Canaan. I want you to go to Egypt and lead my people out of slavery." Moses was terrified but God told him "I will be with you."

Make flatbread: Mix a cup each of wholemeal and plain white flour with a half cup of water and a few drops of oil. Add more water slowly until the dough can be shaped into a moist ball. Knead thoroughly and divide into ping-pong sized balls. On a floured surface roll balls into 3 inch circles. Brush with oil, fold and roll out again. Cook on both sides in a hot frying pan and eat while still warm.

After escaping from the Egyptians Moses and the Israelites travelled through the desert until they reached Mount Sinai, where God first spoke to Moses. All through the journey the Israelites had been grumbling and complaining and misbehaving. They set up camp below the great mountain. Moses went up the mountain to pray and listen to God.

God gave Moses Ten Commandments, to tell the Israelites, God's chosen people. These were rules about the correct way to behave.
