Fr Daniel writes:

We all know it even though we may prefer not to think too much about it. But the time will come when we have to say goodbye to everyone we have met. And because it is such an important and inevitable part of human life, the Bible presents us with very many of such moments. Laban, a malicious and scheming man, but one with a human heart after all, had to say goodbye to his two daughters as they left to a distant country. Naomi, who became penniless following the death of her husband and two sons, saw herself forced to let her daughterin-law Orpah go back to her country. Elisha had only few hours to go home and greet his parents before he left together with the prophet Elijah. We are also fortunate to have records of the last words of Jacob, Moses, Joshua, Samuel, David... and of so many leaders of God's people. The New Testament as well, is full of such moments, especially in the life of Paul, who in his missionary zeal kept moving from city to city. Indeed, the last words of our Lord Jesus recorded in the Gospels have all the elements of a farewell speech too.

But we must not think of separation as a mere cruel whim of life. Separation is but the necessary space that we all need, so that all the wounds we carry and the ones we have inflicted on each other may heal. Only then, we will be ready to enjoy the vision of God and the company of each other for eternity.

Rather unexpectedly, perhaps, this Thursday we had to say goodbye also to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. With her dedication and work, with her sense of humour and warmth, with her unfailing presence and assurance, she won a space in everyone's home and heart, and well beyond British shores.

She was only 21 when from Cape Town she broadcast a message on radio – or rather, the wireless, as it was known then. With millions of people listening to her words she made her solemn act of dedication. "It is very simple" she said: "I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service". There may be a better time, and more writing space, to do justice to all that Elizabeth R did and was. For now, it is enough to underline that she was utterly and tirelessly faithful to that simple act of dedication until she breathed her last breath. May she rest in peace.

And lastly, comes my turn to say farewell. In my brief, but intense, time here in Chiswick I have got to know so many of you and to share with you moments of sorrow and joy, of difficulties and consolations. And for this time we have been together, for all that you have done for me, for what you have taught me, for the opportunities you have given me to grow and mature, for your corrections, for your generous gifts and for all the prayers that I know you have said for me, I would like to say: *Thank you*.

SCHOOL APPLICATIONS, SECONDARY AND PRIMARY, 2022. The series of 10-minute appointments with Fr Michael for a Certificate of Catholic Practice will run weekly from 14th Sept through to 15th October for secondary applications and later for primary. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP), if your Catholic practice allows for it, you should firstly contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (which can also be sent electronically). You should secondly complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Fr Michael. You should not bring blank CCPs from schools. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. The period of churches being closed is irrelevant because Catholic practice is to be evidenced over several years. It is also perfectly feasible to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. The application would be categorised according to the admission criteria published by the particular school. Phone or email the office from Tuesday 13th Sept for a 10-minute appointment this week within: Weds 14th 3.00-5.50pm; Thurs 15th 3.00-4.00pm; Fri 16th 3.00pm-5.00pm.

Part 2 of the current Baptism Preparation Course for those seeking their first baptism for a baby or infant is on **13th September** in the church and St Edward's Room.
