# Fr Michael writes:

I am the more bewildered about the current volatility around Ukraine because as recently as 3<sup>rd</sup> January this year there was such relatively good news from the politics between some of the world's great powers. In lieu of their scheduled 'Tenth Review Conference of the [nuclear arms] Non-Proliferation Treaty' postponed due to the pandemic, the leaders of 'the Five Nuclear-Weapon States' issued a rare joint statement. They declared:

The People's Republic of China, the French Republic, the Russian Federation, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and the United States of America consider the avoidance of war between Nuclear-Weapon States and the reduction of strategic risks as our foremost responsibilities.

If the horrific consequences of nuclear war were their prime matter of agreement, nonetheless they all agreed that one of their 'foremost responsibilities' was the reduction of strategic risks, which surely includes conventional war, of which apparently there is now such a danger, if not technically between these five states. They reassuringly agreed that, "We affirm that a nuclear war cannot be won and must never be fought" but then go on to broaden out the joint approach:

We underline our desire to work with all states to create a security environment more conducive to progress on disarmament with the ultimate goal of a world without nuclear weapons with undiminished security for all. We intend to continue seeking bilateral and multilateral diplomatic approaches to avoid military confrontations, strengthen stability and predictability, increase mutual understanding and confidence, and prevent an arms race that would benefit none and endanger all. We are resolved to pursue constructive dialogue with mutual respect and acknowledgment of each other's security interests and concerns.

'Stability and predictability' is hardly a description of the current situation pertaining to Ukraine. Pope Francis has called for prayer for the current situation at his Angelus address in St Peter's Square on 26<sup>th</sup> January: "*I make a heartfelt appeal to all people of good will to raise prayers to Almighty God that all political actions and initiatives may be at the service of human brotherhood rather than partisan interests.*" So let us redouble our spiritual efforts in praying for peace and diplomacy.
