2ND SUNDAY OF LENT

Fr Michael writes:

Peter, James and John are amazed at what they saw on the summit of the holy mountain when Jesus was transfigured in their presence. The fact that He was the Son of God was clear for the disciples to see as the glory of His divine life blazed forth in brilliant light. "It is wonderful for us to be here" mumbles St Peter, not really sure of what he was saving being so dazed or frightened by the experience. But the word used for 'transfiguration' in the original Greek of the Gospel is 'metamorphosis', which translates more normally as 'transformation'. And who, after all, is *actually being transformed* in this episode on the mountain? Jesus is just demonstrating the glory which is His as the Only Son of the Father, showing His divine life which is *alwavs in* Him. always Him. The disciples, on the other hand, are indeed transformed by the experience. They now know they have seen God; their lives will never be the same again and they will remember this moment forever, even when they must share another mountain with Christ, which is to say Mount Calvary rather than Mount Tabor, sharing Christ's Cross rather than His glory. But, throughout the journey the disciples take with Him in His public ministry from Galilee to Jerusalem, it is this moment, His Transfiguration which is their transformation because it is the *confirmation* of all that they have seen in His miracles and His words. And if we too, at the Father's bidding, listen to Him, this can be the renewal of our transformation too.

Pope St Leo the Great, however, invites us to reflect that in order to share the glory of Tabor we must also share the sacrifice of Calvary: None must fear to suffer for righteousness' sake. For through toil comes rest; through death comes life. Jesus has taken upon His own shoulders all the weakness of our humility. If we are steadfast in our love of Him, in Him we win the victory He won and received the reward that He has promised. To help us do what He asks and endure our trials in patience, we must have always ringing in our ears these words of the Father, 'This is my beloved Son with Whom I am well pleased — listen to Him.' By changing His appearance in this way He chiefly wished to prevent His disciples from feeling scandalized in their hearts by the cross. He did not want the disgrace of the passion to break their faith. With the same foresight the foundation of His holv Church's hope was laid, so that the Body of Christ should realise the nature of the change which it must undergo, and that the members might promise themselves a share in that honour which had already shone around in their Head. Jesus Christ.

A) WEEKLY SPIRITUAL EXERCISES FOR LENT:

TUESDAYS 6.30pm to 7.30pm: 'ENCOUNTERING THE SPIRIT' – a small group prayer experience based on the spiritual listening and speaking learned from the synodal process. Each week we will reflect together on the previous Sunday's Gospel and how to put it into practice. The meeting is on Tuesday 15th March in the St Edward's Room on the theme of 'Aspect of Jesus' face'.

B) LENT PROJECT 2022:

As pre-pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one *domestic* and one *overseas*. In the first week of Lent: £116. *Thank you*.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10th year of foundation) social outreach projects. COMBONI-150 is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150th anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will go directly to Comboni social outreach projects overseas often in areas of tension and conflict such as a clinic and school on the Ugandan border supporting refugees from South Sudan; and schools in Congo and Sri Lanka.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity. Undesignated cheques will be divided as per the cash in the Lent Project box.
