Fr Míchael wrítes:

Notwithstanding that today in the UK is a day dedicated to right remembrance of inestimable sacrifice, it is also across the Catholic world, Pope Francis' sixth World Day of the Poor and for which he has written a rich and poignant 'Message' which I have been reading, but which, at 3,000 words, is too long to reproduce easily though it bears much reflection. With "Jesus Christ... for your sakes became poor" (cf. 2 Cor 8:9) being the theme, Francis points out that this is the Apostle Paul addressing the first Christians of Corinth encouraging them to show solidarity with their brothers and sisters in need in Jerusalem where "the community of Jerusalem was experiencing great hardship due to a food shortage in the country". Thus Paul sets about organizing a weekly collection. If this sounds remarkably familiar the Pope makes it clearer still: From that time on, every Sunday, during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, we have done the same thing, pooling our offerings so that the community can provide for the needs of the poor. It is something that Christians have always done with joy and a sense of responsibility, to ensure that none of our brothers or sisters will lack the necessities of life.

Also familiar to us is that danger of compassion fatigue: As for the community of Corinth, after the initial outburst of enthusiasm, their commitment began to falter and the initiative proposed by the Apostle lost some of its impetus. For this reason, Paul wrote them, asking in impassioned terms that they relaunch the collection, "so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means" (2 Cor 8:11). With the immensity of current need both across the world and at home ("What great poverty is produced by the senselessness of war!" he writes): This is the moment for us not to lose heart but to renew our initial motivation. The work we have begun needs to be brought to completion. That, in effect, is precisely what solidarity is: sharing the little we have with those who have nothing, so that no one will go without.

However: It is not activism that saves, but sincere and generous concern that makes us approach a poor person as a brother or sister who lends a hand to help me shake off the lethargy into which I have fallen. The message of Jesus shows us the way and makes us realize that there is a poverty that humiliates and kills, and another poverty, Christ's own poverty, that sets us free and brings us peace. The poverty that kills is squalor, injustice, exploitation, violence and the unjust distribution of resources. The poverty that sets us free, on the other hand, is one that results from a responsible decision to cast off all dead weight and concentrate on what is essential.
