# For their annual *White Flower Appeal*, The Society for the Protecion of Unborn Children (SPUC) writes:

Our mission is to save the lives of unborn babies and to protect women from abortion. Tragically, the threats facing unborn children in our country are great. Over ten million precious babies have lost their lives because of abortion since 1967. And millions of women and men have been deeply wounded too.

In recent months, SPUC has focused on the problem of abortion coercion. An independent poll showed that 87% of GPs are concerned about women being coerced into unwanted abortions as a result of the "home abortion" scheme. Coercion is abuse.

DIY "home abortion" makes women much more vulnerable to coercion from abusive partners and family members. Since abortion pills have become available over the phone, women no longer have the opportunity to speak confidentially with any medical professional.

Who might be standing in the background and exerting pressure on the women to whom they speak? It could be abusive parents, partners or even people-traffickers. Last year SPUC agreed to support "Lydia", a hugely courageous young woman who alleges that she was coerced into an abortin by an ex-partner and his family. She says that her ex-partner's aunt – who is a medical doctor – used false medical information to exert pressure.

Lydia tried to kill herself rather than go through with the abortion. But while the abortion provider knew this, they still went ahead with the procedure.

Lydia is overwhelmed with gratitude that SPUC supporters are helping her. She said that if she knew about organisations like SPUC, her baby would be with her today.

We must magnify the voices of women who have suffered. This is a huge blindspot in our public debate: how can abortion be about "choice" when so many women experience coercion?

You can send a powerful message to the Prime Minister TODAY by signing the postcard found at the back of the church as a part of our petition, calling on him to condemn the horror of abortion coercion and take steps to ensure that no other women suffer like Lydia has.

Please fill in your postcard today and either hand it to the priests outside or post it to SPUC. You can also make a prayer pledge to support our work.

POST- EASTER HOLIDAY PILGRIMAGE TO THE LOIRE? - The parish is planning a small group six-day coach trip 17<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2023 to the shrines and wines of the Loire. Based in the ancient Catholic city of Tours we'll visit the shrine of St Martin before further day trips to the medieval city and Cathedral of Orléans frequented by St Joan of Arc during the Siege of Orléans (which, against the English, she won...); also the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud, a World Heritage Site, where, among others, King Henry II of England and his son, King Richard the Lionheart, are buried; also the great Abbaye Saint-Pierre de Solesmes, a vast living monastery with over 1,000 years of history as well as being custodian and promoter of Gregorian chant. Where possible Mass will be celebrated daily at the various sites. There will also be a chance to explore a few of the vineyards of the Loire's celebrated wines. Sadly we will not have time to visit any of the Loire's famous royal chateaux. Travelling by coach and Eurotunnel, and staying in central two-star ensuite accommodation, the approximate cost, while details are still to be finalised, will be £750 excluding lunch, supper and admission charges.
