Fr Jude writes:

Last Friday was the Feast of our parish's second patron St Edward the Confessor. The son of King Ethelred III and his Norman wife, Emma, daughter of Duke Richard I of Normandy, he was acclaimed King of England in 1042 with the support of the powerful Earl Godwin, his in-law to be. In 1044, he married Godwin's daughter Edith. St Edward's life was governed by four cardinal principles: fortitude, faith working through love, reconciliation and detachment.

St Edward did not see the crown as a "do or die affair", but with **great fortitude**, "waited for his time". He nevertheless, disposed himself for his God-given destiny, by patiently acquiring all the practical skills needed for leadership, with his 20-year period of exile in Normandy.

As a **man of faith that worked through love** (Galatians 4:6), his love for the Church and his subjects was visibly manifested in the construction, under his instructions, of the iconic St. Peter's Abbey at Westminster, better known as Westminster Abbey, and the removal of obnoxious taxes of the time in his "generally peaceful reign."

As a man of **reconciliation**, St Edward's conciliatory spirit enabled him weave through the crisis and challenges that he encountered in trying to maintain a delicate "balance of relationships" and "alliances" in his biological and nuclear family, his subjects of the kingdom of England and with his allies in Normandy (France). His struggles, generated by the tensions between Godwin his Father-in-Law and his Saxon supporters on the one hand, and the Norman barons on the other, was partly caused by his natural inclination to favour the Normans who were his kinsmen. St Edward's latter reconciliation with his mother, Emma who had once abandoned him at Normandy, for the lustre of the throne, as well as the normalization of his relationship with his estranged wife Edith, are testaments to his spirit of forgiveness.

These noble virtues of his were anchored on his **spirit** of detachment. Edward was not power drunk; rather, he was soberly intoxicated with the Holy Spirit. This enabled him to freely delegate his authority to his noblemen, while he made time to enjoy his recreation as well as other religious activities. St Edward thus sought the kingdom of God and its righteousness and other things were added unto him. This included the grace of a good death in London on January 5, 1066, surrounded by loved ones and his subjects with plenty of miracles attributed to his name.

As we remember this great saint who lived out the gospel in words and deeds, let us imitate his fortitude, faith, and self-denial so needed in our age where these values are fast being eroded by unbridled hedonism and loss of the sense of the sacred.

St Edward the Confessor, pray for us.

SCHOOL APPLICATIONS, SECONDARY AND PRIMARY, 2023. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP), if your Catholic practice allows for it, you should firstly contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (which can also be sent electronically). You should secondly complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Canon Michael. You should not bring blank CCPs from schools. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. The period of churches being closed is irrelevant because Catholic practice is to be evidenced over several years. It is also *perfectly feasible* to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. The application would be categorised according to the admission criteria published by the school.
