### Tomas writes:

Ecce Homo! Behold the man! With these words Pontius Pilate presented Our Lord, crowned with thorns, to the crowd. I am writing these lines from Jerusalem where I am on a week-long retreat and pilgrimage. It is only a short walk to the place on Via Dolorosa where these words were uttered. Staying true to the deep roots of my family in the Hapsburg empire, I have found my temporary home at the Austrian Hospice, founded in 1854 by the then Archbishop of Vienna. It is the oldest national pilgrim house in the Holy Land (I am happy not only about the Daily Offices and Mass in German, but also about the best Sacher cake in the Middle East). – Ecce Homo! Pontius Pilate was surely not aware of the profundity of his words. As one retraces the steps of Our Lord, one becomes more and more aware that we have been saved and redeemed because the man Jesus accepted the ultimate impotence of death: this acceptance began with the Incarnation and became definitive at Golgotha. Living our Christian lives truly, we cease to live simply as humans and begin to live as someone who doesn't just 'imitate Christ' but who is drawn into Him and, as a result of the eternal significance of Jesus's humanity, genuinely participates in His Incarnation, death and Resurrection. We are redeemed and saved because we are able to respond, as true humans, to the permanent appeal of loving our neighbour, to accept death, and continue to hope. In Jesus, we are not called to understand our faith as a sum of prescriptions and obligations imposing an external burden, but invited to rejoice that we have found the ground of our world and have a word for it: 'Father'. We are called to find God not just in eternal distance but also in the forgiving nearness, for in Jesus, at a turning point of world's history, our future has become reality – and we know that this reality is good. God will always be with us because the God who became man can never cease to be one of us. Ecce Homo! In Jesus, we have been redeemed not only from sin but also from the idols of this world. In Jesus, we have found the confidence to encounter our lives with serenity and inner peace that others can only envy, sustained by the sure knowledge that this world is not the only reality. In Jesus, we know that death is not a conclusion, but a fulfilment. For the man Jesus of Nazareth is none other than the one by whom God the Father intended from all eternity to reconcile us to His divine self. Ecce Homo!
