Fr Daniel writes.

In the Gospel today we hear about the first sign that Jesus made during his public ministry. A sign full of symbolism that encapsulates the Mystery to be revealed throughout the Gospel. The dreariness of the water is transformed into the joy of wine. The jars of the Old Law serve to bring the New. Humanity driven to chaos by their first parents are now adopted and brought to safety by God and entrusted to the motherly care of Mary. Since there is no room, even over an entire newsletter, to make a commentary of this Gospel that would do any justice to its richness, we should concentrate on one world only: "woman".

The word "woman" takes us back to the very beginnings of the book of Genesis when God created the perfect companion for Adam. "Then, the Lord God made the man fall into a deep sleep. And, while he was asleep, he took one of his ribs and closed the flesh up again forthwith. The Lord God fashioned the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man. And the man said: This one at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh! She is to be called Woman". Later on in the story we learn that "The man named his wife 'Eve' because she was the mother of all those who live".

However, John in his Gospel, does not reveal the full implications of this title that Jesus gives to his mother, until nearly the very end. There at the cross we hear Jesus addressing his mother as "woman" for the second time: "Seeing his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing near her, Jesus said to his mother, 'Woman, this is your son.' Then to the disciple he said, 'This is your mother.' [...] After Jesus had taken the wine he said, 'It is fulfilled'; and bowing his head he gave up his spirit".

It is at this point that we come to understand the reason why Jesus addressed his mother as "woman" all the time. It was not to distance himself from his mother but to reveal to her and to us the full scope of her mission. As we see Jesus, the new Adam "falling asleep" on the cross, and as his side is gashed opened, Mary appears as the new Eve. No longer as the "mother of all those who live", but as the mother of all who believe.

What a wonderful capacity, that of God, to make all things new! How attentive to the needs of His children! How loving and caring, so that none of His creatures should ever feel alone and unprotected. It is right, therefore, that we should acclaim together in the words of the Responsorial Psalm: "O sing a new song to the Lord, sing to the Lord all the earth. O sing to the Lord, bless his name".

THE SYNODAL PROCESS: WRAPPING UP, FOR NOW - With



21st January being the deadline for submission of the parish report to the diocese the final session will be at 4.00pm to 5.30pm TODAY, Sunday 16th January in the Parish Centre. We'll start, aiming to be socially distanced, in the Lounge Bar and, depending on numbers, might move to the Main Hall. This

concluding meeting is aimed at all those who have participated in previous sessions, and will be reflecting on the whole parish process and helping to prepare the parish submission to the diocese with any last contributions. Fr Michael and Clare Muldoon, the Parish Synodality Rep, will then write up the submission to be in by 21st January. With the Synod being '2021-2023' parishes will certainly have more to discuss and, perhaps finally and most importantly, the implementation in the parish of the resolutions of the Bishops' Synod in 2023. In the meantime, the 'diocesan phase' of the synodal process is underway. The 'Diocesan Synodal Gathering' with Cardinal Vincent at Westminster Cathedral & Hall is on Saturday 19th February, 11.00am to 4.00pm. If you have been part of the parish synodal process and would like to join the diocesan gathering for the day, please see Fr Michael or Clare Muldoon before too long as places need to be booked by 31st January.

CRIB OFFERINGS - The Crib Offerings as by custom will go to the Westminster Catholic Children's Society to help disadvantaged children and families locally. This will help provide mental health services, family support and emergency grants for vulnerable children in our Diocese. Offerings can be made in the Crib Offering marked candle safes beside the crib. Offerings for the candles at the crib should also be placed in the Crib Offerings boxes. the crib will remain up until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, Candlemas, Weds 2nd February.

SCHOOL APPLICATIONS - To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice, *if your Catholic practice allows for it,* you should contact the Parish Office to request an appointment. Please ensure you also complete a self-assessment form by obtaining a copy from the Parish Office BEFORE meeting Fr Michael. If you are a Catholic but not a *practising* Catholic, coming to Mass *habitually,* over the last *several years* (therefore including before the pandemic) it is likely that it will be impossible for Fr Michael to issue a Certificate.
