Fr Daniel writes:

Faith and Suffering

One of my lasting memories of St Pope John Paul II, was a frail man, at the mercy of Parkinson's disease but who continued to appear in public. Cardinal Angelo Comastri, who was with the Pope during his last few months observed, "John Paul II knew that life is a race towards God's Banquet: the Feast of God's embrace, His infinite glory and happiness." Through his suffering John Paul II bore witness to a greater reality, he understood that as St Paul says in our second reading today, that what we suffer in this life, pales in comparison to the joys to come in the next. Both these Saints testified to the realities beyond this life by embracing their suffering with faith. They understood that it was Jesus' suffering and death which made his resurrection and ascension possible. Jesus shows us how human suffering can be transformative, how it can aide us in our quest to become holy. This is not an easy lesson for us to learn and rather than accept this, we instead find ourselves asking God why we must suffer so much? Recently, after I learnt that I had torn a small hole in my ligament I certainly asked God this question. However, as time has gone on, I have started to ask a different question: what does God want to me learn from this? After much prayer and reflection, I can see that he wishes me to devote more time to spiritual reading, which I have neglected this last year, so much so that I currently have four books I have started and still not finished! I am sure that in time I will return to playing the sport I love, but until then, as I continue my recovery, I will use the time to catch up on my reading. There is no easy answer to why we suffer in this life, but Cardinal Van Thuan encourages us to turn to a crucifix, which reminds us that when "Jesus' arms and legs [were] nailed to the Cross, and life [was] draining out of his body, it was then he accomplished the most for humanity. At his weakest moment, Jesus redeemed the world." This truth consoles and strengthens us, for as St Paul goes onto say to the Romans, we hope in what we cannot see, not just the kingdom to come but also that in our suffering, in those moments when we find it the hardest to see our God, are the moments when our God is closest to us, when his grace is most effective. We may not always be able to see him, but our God is always there, helping us along our path to holiness, no matter how painful that may be at times, so that like his Son, one day we too may share in his glory.
