### EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION

#### Fr Michael writes:

# "Stay with us Lord! Alleluia!" With these words Pope Saint John Paul II concluded his

astonishing twenty-six years of public addresses as Pope on Easter Sunday 2005, his last urbi et orbi, to the city and to the world. The phrase is taken from St Luke's Gospel (24:29), from the disciples who, on the evening of Easter Day, met a stranger on the road to Emmaus but not recognising that they walked with the Risen Christ asked Him to stay with them for supper. So downcast they had been with the death of Jesus that in spite of their hearts burning within them as He talked to them along the road, they didn't finally recognise Him until the breaking of the bread at supper in the Eucharist, whereupon they ran back to the apostles to confirm that they had seen the Risen Lord. The phrase is also the title John Paul gave to his last Apostolic Letter which was centred on the Eucharist and in which he writes: "When the disciples on the way to Emmaus asked Jesus to stay with them, he responded by giving them a much greater gift: through the Sacrament of the Eucharist he found a way to stay in them. Present in the Eucharist as the Risen Lord he nonetheless bears the marks of his Passion, of which every Mass is a memorial. At the same time, while the Eucharist makes present what occurred in the past, it also impels us towards the future, when Christ will come again at the end of history. This makes the Eucharist an event which draws us into itself and fills our Christian journey with hope." One who was drawn deeply into this event was St Mary Magdalene. Present at the Lord's death, she was the first witness of the Resurrection. "Tell us Mary, what didst thou see upon the way?" begins the ancient prayer called the Easter Sequence which we read in Easter Sunday's Masses. And she replies to us "I saw Christ's glory as he rose". Her tears mourning Jesus give way to her rejoicing in His glory as she clings to Him. She recognises that the glory she sees in Him was the same glory which forgave her sins, the same glory which cast out devils from her, the same glory which purified her heart and freed her from herself so that she could love as she did. And it is the *same* glory which transforms her into glory, for the Risen Lord Jesus is risen precisely to call us into His Risen Life, the Divine Life, to share in His Resurrection. And this, after His Ascension, she will have received in the Eucharist: "Those who feed on Christ in the Eucharist," writes John Paul in his encyclical Eccleisa de Eucharistia, "need not wait until the hereafter to receive eternal life: they already possess it on earth. This pledge of future resurrection comes from the fact that the flesh of the Son of Man, given as food, is his body in its glorious state after the resurrection. With the Eucharist we digest, as it were, the secret of the resurrection, a medicine of immortality, an antidote to death." A Happy & Holy Easter!

#### **LENT PROJECT 2022:**

As pre-pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one *domestic* and one *overseas*. In the five weeks of Lent: £7937 *Thank you*.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10<sup>th</sup> year of foundation) social outreach projects. For what it does and which projects are supported see: <a href="https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/">https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/</a> There are specific Cardinal's Appeal envelopes at the exits of the church.

<u>COMBONI-150</u> is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will go directly to assist Comboni Sr Rosemary Herrera (no relation of Fr Daniel...) in Arequipa, Peru. She is hoping for a total of £4855 in support of her ecological project among families in subsistence living. The project aims to provide two bio-gardens as 'sow a seed and you feed a village' but also, in the interim, some food parcels and meals to those developing these gardens which will belong to the villagers.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity.
