Fr Daniel writes:

Pope St Paul VI surprised the world on 4th December 1963 with the announcement that he was traveling to the Holy Land as a pilgrim: "We are so convinced that for the final happy conclusion of this Council prayers and good works are necessary, that after careful deliberation and much prayer we have decided to become a pilgrim ourselves in the land of Jesus Our Lord". It is impossible in these few lines to do justice to the historical significance of such a journey. Paul VI was the first Pope to return to the Holy Land after St Peter left it to go to Rome. It was also during that journey that we saw St Peter embracing his brother St Andrew again, in the persons on their successors: the Pope and the Patriarch of Constantinople. But even more important still, for us and for the future of the Church, was the Pope's intention with this pilgrimage: "ritornare alle sorgenti" (to return to the sources). St Paul VI was the man chosen by God with the responsibility of directing the Church, equip it and prepare it, for the many challenges and evils of the third millennium, and under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit he understood that there is no future for the Church if we do not remain consistent and faithful to our origins.

With the same intention of "returning to the sources" and looking for the same renewal and assurance I, together with another 29 priests of this diocese, have been visiting the Holy Land for the past two weeks. Our intention was to go all the way back, to the beginnings of the History of Salvation. So, our journey took us to Egypt, the place which saw the birth of the People of Israel and also the place where Jesus spent his infancy. From Egypt we followed the itinerary of the Exodus, across the Red Sea to Mount Sinai where God gave his people the Ten Commandments. After spending a few days in the desert, we made our way to Jordan. And from there across the River Jordan into Israel and Palestine: the Promised Land.

The importance of this pilgrimage was not so much to visit the places connected to the Bible, but to live spiritually the experience of the Exodus. Starting in Egypt, in Hebrew: "Mizraim", which translates as "anguish" or "narrowness". And from there to the desert, the place chosen by God to purify and speak to heart of his people. And only then, after experiencing the love and providence of God be ready to cross the Jordan into the Land that "*flows with milk and honey*". This is the itinerary that every Christian must follow. A journey from the anguish and narrowness of sin to the wide and fertile land of Heaven, passing through the waters of baptism and the many trials and difficulties of this life which serve to purify our souls and also to gain an experience of the love and providence of God.

FR. DANIEL TO DEPART and FR DANIEL TO ARRIVE, together with FR. ERASMUS: Fr Daniel has been with us since Sept 2021 and impelled as he ever has been by a strong sense of mission (cf 2Cor 5:14) - which brought him to our diocese and parishes - he offered himself to the Cardinal for 'Missio ad gentes' to be sent further afield for the mission of the Church. He has learned that he is to go to the Diocese of Plymouth for some years. The move is scheduled for Sept 2022 so we'll have time for a Farewell Mass before his departure. In the mean time, his successor in Chiswick has been announced also, the newly ordained Fr Daniel Daley. Fr Daniel was ordained priest on 25th June in Westminster Cathedral so let us pray for him together with the three other newly ordained priests, Fr Mike Guthrie and Fr David Cherry, both of whom have had placements in Chiswick parish, and Fr Matteo Di Giuseppe. Fr Daniel Daley will move into Chiswick in September to take up his appointment. Bishop John Mbinda's Holy Ghost Father replacement has also been announced by the Spiritans & Diocese. We will look forward to welcoming Fr Erasmus Onyema Egenonu CSSp also in September and trust, if God's Will, that he might stay in the parish a little longer than his illustrious predecessor!
