The last Sunday of Advent before Christmas Day describes the events surrounding the birth of Our Lord, an event anticipated for centuries: God coming into the world and renewing it. Where St Luke concentrates on the character of Mary, St Matthew focuses on the person of Joseph and builds his story upon him, communicating a real sense of a supernatural drama. Both accounts contain the sudden appearance of an angel: in one case to Mary and in the other to Joseph. When Joseph finds out that Mary is pregnant – and he cannot possibly be the father – he faces a dilemma: should he expose Mary to public humiliation or repudiate her privately? But then he has a dream, like Joseph of the Old Testament. In his dream, Joseph finds that he is to become a part of something greater than simply his envisaged marriage: he has been chosen for an extraordinary part in the divine plan for the salvation of the world, for Mary has conceived a child in a supernatural way. Joseph was certainly familiar with our first reading in which Prophet Isaiah promises a great sign. In the original Hebrew text, it says 'A girl is with child' using the word almah which means a girl, an unmarried woman. Later, the text was translated into Greek as 'A virgin will be with a child' and this translation became the basis for the Latin translation of the Bible, known as the Vulgate, which associates Isaiah's prophecy with the Blessed Virgin Mary. Joseph accepts what is asked of him and this makes him a great inspiration for us: in the words of the Holy Father Pope Francis, "Joseph's risk gives us this lesson: to take life as it comes. Has God intervened there? I accept it." He no longer follows his own desires but entrusts himself, silently and humbly, without reserve, to God's greater plan. "In Joseph, we never see frustration, but only trust," said Pope Francis, "his patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust." Infinitely surpassed by the mystery, both Joseph and Mary are willing to fully comply with God's will, content with the place that they were assigned. They both face an enormous challenge to their fidelity and trust in God, awaiting the reactions of their family and neighbours. However, Mary and Joseph remain the most authentic heirs of the faith of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. Their faith involves trusting in God's plan - which often remains clouded with mystery. Let us pray that we too allow ourselves to be surprised by God when we do not expect it, discovering also in our lives the mystery of eternal joy and love, forever embodied in the One who will be born in a week's time.
