MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

Fr Daniel writes:

Who has never been at Mass and suddenly heard the name of a completely unknown character in one of the readings? This Sunday might be one of those days, and since the temptation to pull out the phone in the middle of Mass and Google the name might just get a little too overwhelming for some, I decided to spare you the struggle by dedicating few lines to the character of Melchizedek.

This character appears only twice in the Old Testament, in chapter 14 of Genesis and once more in Psalm 110. But despite his being such an obscure individual the striking similarities between him and Jesus have fed Christian imagination from the very early days. Melchizedek was King and Priest of Salem, a place that psalm 76 identifies as Jerusalem. Jesus too is King and Priest of the Heavenly Jerusalem. His name can also mean 'King of justice' and 'King of peace', but is there any king who has brought to the world justice and peace like Jesus has? Melchizedek was believed to be "without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life" (Heb 7:3) and so does the Word exist from before all ages. But also, having no father and mother, and therefore being unable to trace his ancestry to the tribe of Levi - from which all priests must come - Melchizedek's priesthood had to be of a completely new kind, just like Jesus' priesthood is of a new kind. And if that was not enough, Melchizedek appears offering unusual sacrifices of bread and wine, which Jesus also used when he instituted the Eucharist.

Jesus and Melchizedek, however, are united by more than these allegorical connections. When King David was anointed King of Israel, God envisaged his kingship as that of Melchizedek, which united in one single person the figure of the King and the High Priest. "*The Lord has sworn oath to David, he will not change.* 'You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old." (Psalm 110:4). David was made, therefore, the legitimate successor of Melchizedek. Jesus, being a descendant of David, inherited from him both the Kingship and the priesthood, becoming the legitimate but also the ultimate successor of Melchizedek. "And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him, being designated by God a high priest after the order of Melchizedek" (Heb 5:9-10).

Who exactly was this figure of the Old Testament? This is a question that still remains open. Some say Melchizedek was a Canaanite priest. Others believe he was Shem, the firstborn son of Noah, who lived until the time of Abraham (500 years according to Gen 11:11). What all Christian theologians agree on, however, is that he is a figure that points towards Christ and speaks of God's intention to save the whole of humanity.

FR. DANIEL TO DEPART and FR DANIEL TO ARRIVE, together with FR. ERASMUS: Chiswick priestly moves in the onward mission of the Church: Fr Daniel has been with us since Sept 2021 and impelled as he ever has been by a strong sense of mission (cf 2Cor 5:14) - which brought him to our diocese and parishes - he offered himself to the Cardinal for 'Missio ad gentes' to be sent further afield for the mission of the Church. He has learned that he is to go to the Diocese of Plymouth for some years. The move is scheduled for Sept 2022 so we'll have time for a Farewell Mass before his venturing west on mission. In the mean time, his successor in Chiswick has been announced also, the yetto-be-priestly-ordained Deacon Daniel Daley. Deacon Daniel will be ordained priest next Saturday 25th June at 10.30am in Westminster Cathedral. He'd be delighted if parishioners wished to attend his ordination together with three other deacons, including Deacon Mike Guthrie, who was eight months in lockdown in Chiswick Parish as many will remember. [The Ordination Mass will be livestreamed also on https://westminstercathedral.org.uk/] We pray for these four newly ordained priests and give thanks to God for their future ministry. Fr Daniel Daley will then come to Chiswick in September to take up his appointment. Bishop John Mbinda's Holy Ghost Father replacement has also been announced by the Spiritans & Diocese. We will look forward to welcoming Fr Erasmus Onyema Egenonu CSSp also in September and trust, if God's Will, that he might stay in the parish a little longer than his illustrious predecessor!
