Tomas writes:

"I love you, Mother, I have woven a wreath / of rhymes wherewith to crown your honoured name," writes Christina Rossetti (1830-1894), a devout Christian, in whose poetry God is always present. In the end, her love of God even trumped the love to another human: dressed in black, Rossetti embraced lifelong singlehood, her reclusive writing remaining a lasting model of Lenten spirit. These verses, dedicated to her mother, introduce the Mothers' Day which falls on the Fourth Sunday in Lent. Also called Mothering Sunday, this day is a moment of bright joy. Thinking of our mother, we tend to think of tenderness, gentleness, pure and unconditional love. All too often, we have to lose her to realise and appreciate how much she sacrificed for us. - This coming Sunday was originally the day when Christians traditionally visited their "mother church" where they were baptised. In England, girls who worked as maids were given a day off to return to their families. And as Catholics, we have three mothers to remember: our earthly mother, the Church, and the Blessed Virgin Mary. As Pope Francis reminds us, she is not an optional extra, but helps us to grow in love: "Her maternal gaze helps us see ourselves as beloved children in God's faithful people, and to love one another regardless of our individual limitations and approaches. Our Lady keeps us rooted in the Church, where unity counts more than diversity; she encourages us to care for one another." Most of us still remember the time when our mothers used to take us by the hand, leading us through the first steps, helping us to understand the world around us. They were with us, taking everything to their hearts. embracing all things good and bad. Without their guidance we would have been lost, wandering off. Today, without the motherly guidance of the Church, we would grow into indifference and ignorance, becoming mere slaves to the world. We can pass through life safely if we cling to our Heavenly Mother, gathered under her mantle. However, there is also a conundrum of every mother's vocation: as she holds her children to her heart, she also prepares them for independence. The Mother of Sorrows stands soon at the foot of Jesus's cross, in agony with the suffering of her Son, as do all mothers for their children, their love being selfgiving and self-emptying. Let us thank all mothers for who they are, keeping the eternal gift of unconditional love alive in the world, in the beautiful words of Christina Rossetti: "In you not fourscore years can dim the flame /Of love, whose blessed glow transcends the laws /Of time and change and mortal life and death."
