Fr Michael writes:

"Eat well, drink well and serve God well," is one of the surprising maxims of the great St Hugh of Lincoln (c1140-1200), whose feast day was on Friday, in spite of the fact that he was a monk of one of the strictest and most penitential orders in the Church, the Carthusians. His home monastery was the Grande Chartreuse in France, as in the 2017 film *Into* Great Silence but he had been sent over to run the English Carthusian house before being appointed Bishop of Lincoln and, among many other things, contributing greatly to the building of the spectacular cathedral there. Eminently spiritual, as befits his monastic heart and formation he was practical, nonetheless courageous immensely compassionate. Full of the love of Christ he was also robust to help us avoid the judgement of today's Gospel passage for instance: "When God finally judges each individual He will not hold it against him that he had not been a hermit or a monk but rejection will come if he has not been a real Christian. A Christian is expected to possess three virtues; if one of them is lacking, the name of 'Christian', without the reality of being one, will profit him nothing. From each will be required always to have charity in the heart, truth in the mouth and chastity in the body.

How do we 'serve God well' when we can feel so powerless in the face of so much suffering and injustice in the world, even more of which we'll hear about in this weekend's appeal from Aid to the Church in Need? I'm sure if the power of government, the levers of state or immense wealth were bestowed upon any of us, we'd feel more able to make a difference. But in today's parable, Jesus offers us a greater truth. We're not required to have 'everything' to do what is right and good, to produce our fruit. We must do this from within the ordinary circumstances in which we find ourselves, whether we have five talents, two or one. It is by this measure that our greatness or our meanness is revealed. Whatever the odds stacked against us, what we must not do, like the wicked lazy servant, is turn in on ourselves when our good and the good of others depends upon our turning outwards, in exactly the opposite direction, like those two servants called to share in their Master's joy.

This weekend we have an appeal from *Aid to the Church in Need* (ACN) which supports persecuted and oppressed Christians through prayer, information and action. ACN supports more than 5,000 projects helping the Church internationally. Thus we'll have a second collection after all Masses. For more information perhaps visit their website: www.acnuk.org

PRIMARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS 2023. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP) you should firstly contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (also sent electronically). You should secondly complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Canon Michael. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. It is also perfectly feasible to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. Your application will simply be categorised as according to the admissions' criteria advertised on the school's website.
