### Fr. Daniel writes:

#### Guide us to thy perfect light

As we close on the end of 2022 and the beginning of a new year, we rightly reflect on what has passed and look to the future. We honour the Mother of God today but the feast of the Epiphany this coming Friday also offers us encouragement through the actions of the three wise men of how we can discover our God and follow the path of holiness he sets before us.

First, the wise men recognised in their work of astrology, something of God, and they followed his star, despite not knowing precisely where it would lead. As St John Chrysostom observes, "God calls them by means of the things that they are most familiar with." God gives us clues and hints through the events and people in our lives to help lead us back to him. Like the wise men, we too need wisdom to recognise these signs and courage when we find them to follow them, trusting that God knows the way.

Second, we should not despair if we lose sight of God's path for us at times, like the Three Kings we should not be afraid to ask for directions. When difficulties arise, when the events in our life make us lose sight of God and his path, it is important to ask for help. Turn to your priests, to your spiritual director, to those who ought to know, and ask for their guidance. Not all are like King Herod, motivated by their own interests, most want to help us rediscover God's path, and as God demonstrates he will ensure that his plans prevail despite the evil intention of others.

Finally, the wise men after finding the baby Jesus, were preparing to go back the way they came, but God had other plans. When we follow God's plan for us, be prepared for this to be, at times, very different from our own plans. The wise men were receptive to God's instruction and altered their planned route to avoid Herod on their way back. We too are invited to co-operate with God's grace in our lives, to persevere even if it means having to change our own plans because ultimately, we trust that God knows what he is doing.

The Epiphany of the Three Kings reminds us that Jesus came to save all, but not all in the same way. Our path to holiness is unique to us, a journey made for us by our God. Like the wise men, we need to learn to see God's plan for us in the events and people of our lives, trusting that our God knows the way, that he will guide us to his son, Jesus Christ, and ultimately to our heavenly home.

Please ensure you also complete a self-assessment form by obtaining a copy from the Parish Office BEFORE meeting Fr Michael. If you are a Catholic but not a *practising* Catholic, coming to Mass *habitually*, over the last *several years* it is likely that it will be impossible for Fr Michael to issue a Certificate.

POST- EASTER HOLIDAY PILGRIMAGE TO THE LOIRE? - The parish is planning a small group six-day coach trip 17th - 22nd April 2023 to the shrines and wines of the Loire. Based in the ancient Catholic city of Tours we'll visit the shrine of St Martin before further day trips to the medieval city and Cathedral of Orléans frequented by St Joan of Arc during the Siege of Orléans (which, against the English, she won...); also the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud, a World Heritage Site, where, among others, King Henry II of England and his son, King Richard the Lionheart, are buried; also the great Abbaye Saint-Pierre de Solesmes, a vast living monastery with over 1,000 years of history as well as being custodian and promoter of Gregorian chant. Where possible Mass will be celebrated daily at the various sites. There will also be a chance to explore a few of the vineyards of the Loire's celebrated wines. Sadly we will not have time to visit any of the Loire's famous royal chateaux. Travelling by coach and Eurotunnel, and staying in central two-star ensuite accommodation, the approximate cost, while details are still to be finalised, will be £750 excluding lunch, supper and admission charges.
