3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Throughout this time of Easter, the second reading on

Fr Daniel writes:

Sunday will be taken from the book of the Apocalypse. A book renowned for containing characters, figures, visions that for the most part and messages incomprehensible to us. So, what is it all about? Primarily the book contains the vision that John had of the heavenly liturgy. There he saw a throne with someone resplendent as precious stones seated on it. Around him four creatures praise him day and night, "Holy, holy, holy the Lord God the Almighty, who was and is and is to come". Then John saw at the right hand of the one seated on the throne a scroll written on both sides and sealed with seven seals. But no one was found worthy to open it. At this, John started to weep, for if none can open the scroll, whatever is written on it will never come to pass. Then one of the elders approached him and told him that "the Lion of the tribe of Juda has conquered, so that he can open the scroll". When John lifted his eyes, however, behold: the lion is a Lamb which carries the marks of having been slaughtered. He is alive now because he has triumphed over death. That is why he appears with seven thorns – sign of the fulness of power he has received – and seven eyes – sign of the fulness of wisdom. His power and his wisdom come not from his ability to destroy but by having given up his life for the salvation of humanity: he is Christ. At his presence the four creatures who worship God fell before him and worship him also with a 'new song'. He opened the seven seals and the scroll is rolled open, which triggered all that is written in it to take place: the last things pertaining to history. The invasion of a foreign nation (the Parthian Empire) bringing destruction and hunger, followed by plagues designed to convert sinners and finally the destruction of Babylon and the Beast (the Roman Empire), the dragon (Satan), the total victory over death and the liberation of the Children of God who from then on enjoy in the peace of the New Jerusalem. Contrary to what most people think, many of the events described in the book of the Apocalypse have already taken place in history. However, the book of the Apocalypse still remains of interest to us Christians because its central message is eternal and universal: GOD IS WITH HIS PEOPLE. And while it is true that Christians still suffer for their faith (it is believed that 1 in 9 Christians worldwide suffer persecution) victory over the Devil and his schemes and over death itself is certain.

LENT PROJECT 2022:

As pre-pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one *domestic* and one *overseas*. £9338 has been donated todate. *Thank you*.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10th year of foundation) social outreach projects. For what it does and which projects are supported see: https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/ There are specific Cardinal's Appeal envelopes at the exits of the church.

<u>COMBONI-150</u> is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150th anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will go directly to assist Comboni Sr Rosemary Herrera (no relation of Fr Daniel...) in Arequipa, Peru. She is hoping for a total of £4855 in support of her ecological project among families in subsistence living. The project aims to provide two bio-gardens as 'sow a seed and you feed a village' but also, in the interim, some food parcels and meals to those developing these gardens which will belong to the villagers.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity.

FOODBANK COLLECTION - takes place **next weekend** when we make our monthly collection of non-perishable items of food.

PRIEST TRAINING FUND - Next Sunday is Good Shepherd Sunday, the day we pray for priests and for vocations to the priesthood. The annual collection for the Priest Training Fund will take place. This fund pays for the priestly formation of men for the Catholic priesthood. There are currently 58 men studying at Allen Hall seminary, 17 of whom are from our own Diocese, and two men are studying in Rome, also from our Diocese. Last year four men who studied at Allen Hall were ordained to the priesthood. This fund also supports the ongoing formation of our ordained priests. Your generous donation helps ensure we can support these men who are called to be like Christ the Good Shepherd. Donation envelopes are available at the back of the church.
