(Good Shepherd Sunday – Vocations Sunday)

Fr Daniel writes:

21st APRIL 2024

Good Shepherd Sunday is traditionally the weekend where we talk about vocations to the priesthood and religious life, as well as hold the collection for the priests training fund. While this is good, it is also an opportunity to examine our own vocation and how we are living it. Many mistakenly believe that only those called to the priestly or religious life have a vocation, but the reality is that all Christians have a vocation, a calling, a reason God made us. The challenge can be working out what this may be. There are some who know from a young age what they want to be; I was never one of these! My ambitions fluctuated from being a train driver, to a professional footballer, to a lawyer, the one constant in all of that was to be a family man.

Now in my mind I always thought this meant marriage and professional career, yet on both fronts, things did not run smoothly. On the professional front I never seemed to get the jobs I wanted, while on the personal front, I never seemed to meet the right woman at the right time. What changed my approach was to stop asking 'what I wanted' and to start asking God 'what is your plan for my life?' What we want is important because God wants us to be happy, fulfilled, but if we are not even considering God's plan for us, then it is very likely that we will miss our vocation entirely. Only after I asked this question did God reveal to me how I could be the family man I craved, just in a different way to what I expected, not a father to my own but a father to his people.

St Charles de Foucauld said, "God calls all the souls he has created to love him with their whole being, here and hereafter, which means that he calls all of them to holiness, to perfection, to a close following of him and obedience to his will. But he does not ask all souls to show their love by the same works, to climb to heaven by the same ladder, to achieve goodness in the same way." We each have a calling from God that is specific to us; it may be like another, but the path God sets before us is specific to us. For some this will be married life, others single life, for some it will be teaching, for others it will contemplation. Working out our vocation, will take prayer, patience, and trust that God knows what he is doing! Above all it is important to remember that as Fr Stephen Wang writes in a terrific little book on vocations, that "for the Christian a vocation is not just something that God calls us to do, it is also the person calls us to be." The countless saints that have gone before us are a testament to the diversity of vocations there are. Good Shepherd Sunday is an opportunity to reflect and ask ourselves: am I only who I want to be, or am I who God wants me to be?
