Fr Michael writes:

We have just a week left to run for our Parish Lent Project which traditionally ends in this parish on the Solemnity of Pentecost, next Sunday. Thus, a week to go but **we have already done** *spectaculary well raising <u>£14,126!</u> Our target was for £12,000 combined but you have given £9,434 for the St Francis Leprosy Guild and a further £4,691 to the Cardinal's Lenten Appeal. Well done and thank you! If anyone wishes to top up even further, details for donations are overleaf and the project will close next Sunday evening.*

Also on a Franciscan theme, the St Francis Leprosy Guild's coordinator, Eileen, here at the beginning of Lent, is offering free guided tours of the new exhibition about St Francis at the National Gallery in Trafalgar Square, a highlight of which is the actual habit worn by St Francis, in addition to the great art. I wrote last week here about another great medieval mystic, Mother Julian of Norwich on the 650th anniversary that week of her Revelations of Divine Love. I was delighted to see this week that the Holy Father, Pope Francis himself, has sent a message to both the Anglican and Catholic Cathedrals of Norwich expressing his "spiritual closeness" to those celebrating the anniversary and imparting his blessing. He writes:

The profound significance of this English mystic for the Christian tradition speaks to us from across the centuries. Indeed, her maternal influence, humble anonymity, and profound theological insights stand as timely reminders that faith in God's loving providence and holiness of life expressed in generous service to our brothers and sisters in need, are timeless truths underpinning not only the life of Christian discipleship but the very fabric of a just and fraternal society.

Of particular note is Julian's generosity in welcoming those who sought spiritual counsel and encouragement. This willingness to sacrifice self-convenience for the sake of others is especially needed in responding to the endemic problems of isolation and loneliness felt by so many. It is my hope that through a greater appreciation of the life of Mother Julian, Christians today will be encouraged to follow ever more faithfully and joyfully the example of Jesus, the one who came "not to be served but to serve" (Mt 20:28).

How vital, too, for today's world, is the message of God's mercy and compassion revealed to Mother Julian. We learn that she was taught through God's grace that, despite the presence of evil in our midst, "all manner of thing shall be well". I pray that all who face the pressing challenges of war, injustice, ecological disaster or spiritual poverty, may be consoled and strengthened by these enduring words.
