Tomas writes:

When Pope Francis established *Sunday of the Word of God*, he did so on the 30 September 2019, the Feast of St Jerome, the man who translated most of the Bible into Latin – his translation, the Vulgate, became the normative Catholic text for centuries. The purpose of the newly instituted Sunday was setting aside "a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people". This Sunday, we are thus reminded of the seminal importance of the Scriptures for the life of the Church.

There is a profound bond which links the Bible and the faith of believers. We are bound to listen attentively to the word of the Lord, not only in our personal prayer and reflection, but – above all – it the celebration of the sacred liturgy. The Second Vatican Council teaches us that "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body, in that she never ceases, above all in the sacred liturgy, to partake of the bread of life and to offer it to the faithful from the one table of the word of God and the body of Christ'. It is in the liturgy when we hear the word of God as taught by the instrument of the Holy Spirit on earth – the Catholic Church.

Vatican II also reminds us that the sacred Scripture is to be "read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit through whom it was written". It was the Holy Spirit who inspired the writers of the individual books of the Old and the New Testament and which also helped to complete the formation of the canon of the Bible at the end of the 4th century. That same Holy Spirit works in the hearts and minds of those who hear the word of God. We are therefore invited to have continuing confidence in the working of the Holy Spirit as he continues in his own way to inspire and illuminate our hearts whenever the Church authentically teaches and interprets the sacred word. For when sacred Scripture is read in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written, it remains ever new. In the words of Pope Francis: "Every day we read a page of the Gospel, we pray with the Psalms, we read the Prophets, we will be moved by the Lord's faithfulness. Scripture will also help us to understand what the Lord asks of our lives today." May this Sunday of the Word of God help us to grow in our familiarity with the sacred Scriptures, under the reliable guidance of our Church.

POST- EASTER HOLIDAY PILGRIMAGE TO THE LOIRE? - The parish is planning a small group six-day coach trip 17th - 22nd April 2023 to the shrines and wines of the Loire. Based in the ancient Catholic city of Tours we'll visit the shrine of St Martin before further day trips to the medieval city and Cathedral of Orléans frequented by St Joan of Arc during the Siege of Orléans (which, against the English, she won...); also the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud, a World Heritage Site, where, among others, King Henry II of England and his son, King Richard the Lionheart, are buried; also the great Abbaye Saint-Pierre de Solesmes, a vast living monastery with over 1,000 years of history as well as being custodian and promoter of Gregorian chant. Where possible Mass will be celebrated daily at the various sites. There will also be a chance to explore a few of the vineyards of the Loire's celebrated wines. Sadly we will not have time to visit any of the Loire's famous royal chateaux. Travelling by coach and Eurotunnel, and staying in central two-star ensuite accommodation, the approximate cost, while details are still to be finalised, will be £750 excluding lunch, supper and admission charges.
