Fr Daniel writes.

With the beginning of the lockdown around this time two years ago, and while society was thrown into complete chaos due to the shortages of toilet paper, something new and exciting appeared, it was called: THE LIVESTREAMING. Catholics had the possibility, for the first time ever, to fulfil the Sunday Mass obligation from the comfort of their sofa. It was the panacea, the business, it was every Catholic teenager's dream come true. But, just as our worries about the shortages of toiletries soon disappeared, the enthusiasm around following Mass online also vanished very quickly. Something was not working, but what was it?

Some blamed it on the poor video and audio quality or the limitations of the internet bandwidth... but deep down we all knew that following the Mass online was not quite the same. We could not receive Communion, we could not pray together with our brothers and sisters, we were not allowed into the church building, which means so much to us... We tried hard, but there was, and there is, a physical aspect about the sacraments that we cannot avoid nor substitute.

Thank God this situation has now changed. Consequently, the bishops of England and Wales are asking Catholics, who are not impeded for a serious reason, to return to the practice of coming physically to church for Mass on Sundays and Solemnities: "The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply".

[...] "Virtual viewing" of Mass online does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation. It may, however, be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply.

[...] In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Lord's Supper, the Lord Jesus entrusted to us the precious gift of Himself. With humility, we glory in being a Eucharistic people for whom attendance at Mass is essential. Looking forward to the forthcoming feast of Pentecost, we now invite all Catholics who have not yet done so to return to attending Mass in person.

As the Church needs the witness of the presence of each person, so too each believer needs to journey in faith and worship with their fellow disciples. Nourished by our encounter with the Risen Lord Jesus, fed with His Word and His Body and Blood in Holy Communion, and supported by the presence of each other, we receive strength week by week, to serve the Lord and glorify Him with our lives."

LENT PROJECT 2022:

As pre-pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one *domestic* and one *overseas*. £10,069 has been donated todate. *Thank you*.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10th year of foundation) social outreach projects. For what it does and which projects are supported see: https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/ There are specific Cardinal's Appeal envelopes at the exits of the church.

<u>COMBONI-150</u> is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150th anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will assist Comboni Sr Rosemary Herrera in Arequipa, Peru, hoping for a total of £4855. The project aims to provide two bio-gardens as 'sow a seed and you feed a village' but also, in the interim, some food parcels and meals to those developing these gardens which will belong to the villagers.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity.
