Fr Michael writes:

Our parish process of synodality was completed last Sunday when those who had participated in one or another way since last October were invited to contribute to the completion of the 'synthesis form', which is to say our submission to the Diocese before the deadline on 21st January. The Parish Rep, Clare Muldoon and I despatched it on Monday 17th. Overall there had been about 80 participants, some of whom attended three or so times and so a total attendance of 150 at the sessions. This represents about 10% of the parishioners currently active. The annual count of average Sunday Mass attendance in October 2021 was 818 which is half of what it was at the same count in 2019, although double what it was in 2020, with numbers still recovering in the uncertainty of the phases of the pandemic.

In terms of 'journeying together', a key phrase of the synodality process, parishioners *had* felt that the joys and sorrows of the pandemic had been shared. However, one repeated experience was that although those embedded in the community at Our Lady of Grace felt the church was welcoming as they knew many friends and neighbours, those newer to the community felt it was not so welcoming or even unwelcoming. To remedy this perhaps we could start simply greeting those next to us in the pews before or after Mass? We *all* have a role to welcome those at Mass, as the Lord welcomes *us*. St Paul is richly emphatic on this: "*The mystery is Christ among you!*" 1Col.27.

In terms of engagement in the parish's priorities for mission, there was a strong sense of this over the pandemic both among and because of the 180+ Stewards who volunteered to keep the church open for Mass which otherwise would have to have been closed. However, among the subjects raised as areas of neglect in terms of parish mission, there were the green agenda, social activities, and outreach to the poor, to the lapsed, to youth and to those disaffected from the Church for one or another reason. I listened very attentively but somewhat helplessly as all such excellent initiatives would need *volunteers*, with availability, training and commitment, when so many find themselves so heavily committed in other areas of their lives already.

There was a general and shared sense, however, that all of the above manifested great love for the Church universally as well as lived in our parish, for the Mass and for wanting to participate in our local mission. Participants spoke of starting more small groups and events, that if we begin something, then 'the Holy Spirit will do the heavy lifting'! Edified by the process, for my part I thought we should continue to have perhaps two parish-wide 'synodal meetings' a term both to listen and to discern priorities (and therefore associated opportunities) that we might respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit calling us, in our community, to mission.

COMBONI SISTERS 150th ANNIVERSARY OF FOUNDATION -

This year is the Sisters' sesquincentenary being founded in Verona in 1872 for mission in Africa at the time particularly. They are therefore celebrating internationally whilst also raising the profile of the current need for the continuation and development of the missionary imperative they have lived so generously over 150 years. Various celebratory events are planned for London and Chiswick including a Mass and Reception on a Thames cruiser emulating the journey of the first Sisters accompanied by the then Fr Daniel Comboni up the River Nile to the interior of Africa. Firstly. however, the jubilee year will be launched in the parish on Sunday 6th Feb when we will hear a word from one of the Sisters after all Masses. The Comboni magazine will be distributed afterwards.
