Fr Michael writes:

"His mercy is from age to age" (Lk 1:50) is the theme chosen by Pope Francis for today's World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. This celebration of Grandparents and the Elderly and its associated prayer for them is always placed on the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, which this year falls on Wednesday, 26th July. Saints Joachim and Anne being the Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary were thus the Grandparents of Jesus. The words of the theme recall us to the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her elder cousin, St Elizabeth. In his message for today's celebration Pope Francis reflects on the Visitation as:

the joyful meeting, between the young Mary and her elderly relative Elizabeth. Filled with the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth addressed the Mother of God with words that, millennia later, continue to echo in our daily prayer: "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb." The Holy Spirit, who had earlier descended upon Mary, prompted her to respond with the Magnificat, in which she proclaimed that the Lord's mercy is from generation to generation. That same Spirit blesses and accompanies every fruitful encounter between different generations: between grandparents and grandchildren, between young and old. God wants young people to bring joy to the hearts of the elderly, as Mary did to Elizabeth, and gain wisdom from their experiences. Yet, above all, the Lord wants us not to abandon the elderly or to push them to the margins of life, as tragically happens all too often in our time. Let us remember that our life is meant to be lived to the full, and that our greatest hopes and dreams are not achieved instantly but through a process of growth and maturation, in dialogue and in relationship with others. His loving plan spans past, present and future; it embraces and connects the generations. It is greater than we are, yet includes each of us and calls us at every moment to keep pressing forward. In the meeting between Mary and *Elizabeth, between young and old, God points us towards the* future that he is opening up before us. Indeed, Mary's visit and Elizabeth's greeting open our eyes to the dawn of salvation: in their embrace, God's mercy quietly breaks into human history amid abundant joy. From the elderly we received the gift of belonging to God's holy people. The Church, as well as society, needs them, for they entrust to the present the past that is needed to build the future.

He has a strong and practical request, too, that the young make a point of visiting their grandparents or an elderly neighbour living alone this weekend.

SIMPLE MASSES FOR SUMMER: -The Sunday Masses in which there is routinely the Choir or the singing of hymns will become simpler over these weeks of July and August. The 11.00am Choir is on holidays and so are the musicians who support the 9.45am and 12.15pm Masses. It is hoped the 11.00am Mass can sustain hymns. Regarding **weekday Masses**, these will remain the same except that the Friday 6.00pm Mass in the PIME Convent, Chiswick Lane, is suspended for the holiday period and will resume in September.

NEWSLETTERS will continue for the Sundays of July but then they will cease for the month of August with the first Newsletter of the new academic year being on Sunday 3rd September. Those thinking ahead about applications for the new academic year's Youth Confirmation Programme and RCIA (for adults thinking of becoming Catholics or Catholics who have not received the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation) need not be concerned as all details will be published with ample time allowed from September. However, the First Holy Communion programme is detailed immediately below:

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2023/2024 – Registration is OPEN This year the registration for the sacramental programme is online, via the parish website http://www.ourladyofgracechiswick.org The closing date to register for First Holy Communion is Sunday 24th September, with the course beginning with the Enrolment Mass on Sunday 1st October at the 12.15pm Mass. The course is open to parishioners' children living within the parish boundaries of Chiswick, Gunnersbury and Grove Park, and who regularly attend Mass. Exceptionally, others with good reason may apply but those will need permission of their respective Parish Priests.

BAPTISM – The next Baptism Preparation Course for those seeking their first baptism for a baby or infant is on 5th and 12th Sept in the church and St Edward's Room. Apply via the Parish Office or online via the parish website: http://www.ourladyofgracechiswick.org

A PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LISIEUX in the 150th Anniversary of the Birth of St Thérèse - What about combining the delights of autumn in Normandy and immersion, in her sesquicentenary, into the life, spirituality and 'Little Way' of St Thérèse of Lisieux? The four night and five day trip will allow for one full day visiting the places associated with St Thérèse in Lisieux itself, including the Carmelite Convent in which she lived and died in her vocation; then a day in Alençon and environs, the place of her birth and childhood; and finally a day on a thousand years of Norman and British history in a trip to include Falaise Castle, birthplace of William the Conqueror, and the historic city of Bayeux, with Cathedral, Museum and Tapestry, returning to Lisieux via Gold Beach, the central of five heroic landings on D Day 1944. From 16th to 21st October 2023, we travel from and to Chiswick by de luxe minibus via Eurotunnel. We stay in the Grand Hôtel de l'Espérance (3*). Based on fifteen pilgrims (and a stable currency exchange and other costs), single occupancy will be £740; double occupancy just £601 per person, excluding lunches, entrance fees and personal expenses. If interested, please contact the Parish Office. With the parish organizing the trip, pilgrims MUST have personal travel insurance and sign a waiver of liability and assumption of risk. Any monies paid cannot be refunded unless a substitute pilgrim, if a waiting list develops, takes the place of a cancellation.
