DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY, 2nd SUNDAY OF EASTER

Fr Daniel writes:

In English we say "Hello". The Romans said: "Salve", meaning: "be well". The Greeks used "Χαίρε" [chaire] meaning: "rejoice". But the Jews still have the best salute: שלום [Shalom] meaning: peace, wellbeing, joy, health, harmony, wholeness... in essence: every good and every blessing.

In the Gospel this Sunday, the first words of Jesus to his disciples after his death on the cross were precisely: "Peace be with you". And the disciples who were locked down in fear, disappointed, angry with themselves and with one another, full of regrets, shame... suddenly were filled with joy and peace.

But what is this peace that Jesus offers his disciples? Is this the peace of knowing that everything is now OK? That things will somehow go back to normal? That their betrayal was not so serious after all? Surely not. The marks that Jesus shows to his apostles, the wounds that the crucifixion left for ever on his body are the clear evidence that things will, in fact, never be the same again.

However, those precious wounds are not only a reminder of the pain of the cross, but they remain also for eternity as a visible sign of God's unconditional love for us. And that is what brings the disciples so much peace and joy, not that the past is forgotten, but that God's love is stronger than our faults. No wonder why Thomas was so keen on seeing and touching Jesus' wounds! For he too was full of fears, anger and regrets and needed to find some peace.

And like Thomas all of us, and indeed the whole world, need to experience again and again that forgiveness and love from God. It is difficult to turn on the TV or to open the Newspaper these days without seeing the tremendous damage that evil does in the world. And one wonders if we will ever recover, if things will ever be the same. Maybe they won't. But today, Divine Mercy Sunday, we can find comfort in the knowledge that God can heal the wounds and transform what is now painful and divisive into the source of a renewed love and unity.

St John Paul II in his homily for the Canonization of St Faustina Kowalska said: "As the Apostles once did, today too humanity must welcome into the upper room of history the risen Christ, who shows the wounds of his Crucifixion and repeats: Peace be with you! Humanity must let itself be touched and pervaded by the Spirit given to it by the risen Christ. It is the Spirit who heals the wounds of the heart, pulls down the barriers that separate us from God and divide us from one another, and at the same time, restores the joy of the Father's love and of fraternal unity."

LENT PROJECT 2022:

As pre-pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one *domestic* and one *overseas*. In the five weeks of Lent to Palm Sunday: £7937 Donations since then to date will be announced in next weekend's Newsletter. *Thank you*.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10th year of foundation) social outreach projects. For what it does and which projects are supported see: https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/ There are specific Cardinal's Appeal envelopes at the exits of the church.

<u>COMBONI-150</u> is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150th anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will go directly to assist Comboni Sr Rosemary Herrera (no relation of Fr Daniel...) in Arequipa, Peru. She is hoping for a total of £4855 in support of her ecological project among families in subsistence living. The project aims to provide two bio-gardens as 'sow a seed and you feed a village' but also, in the interim, some food parcels and meals to those developing these gardens which will belong to the villagers.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity.

EASTER OFFERINGS - are one of two collections in the year which makes up the greater part of the priests' annual income (stipend). If you will be away over Easter please take an Easter Offering envelope from beside the church doors and drop it into any other routine parish collection before or after Easter or to the presbytery. Thank you for any support you can give the priests!

CATHOLIC LISTENERS - A new confidential listening helpline will launch this month. Catholic Listeners, Diocese of Westminster, has been set up for those who are returning to the faith. The helpline is all about listening to others, listening to those who might have become isolated due to the pandemic. This service is based on the Landings ethos of compassionate listening. Although we are not a counselling service, we have a professional team trained on signposting to other services and agencies. Sometimes just communicating with someone who listens and understands can help clarify a way forward. Simply talking about a problem can ease a burden.
