Fr Michael writes:

Tuesday 26th July is the Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, parents of Mary, and so grandparents of Jesus. This being the case, today as the closest Sunday to the 26th is the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly as instituted by Pope Francis just a year ago in 2021. His theme for this year is from Psalms (92:15), In old age they will still bear fruit. As ever with such a day there is a rich meditation from the Holy Father which rewards reading by every age and generation of reader and which can be easily found in full on the diocesan website [www.rcdow.org.uk] but we are also invited to visit or accompany one or several of the elderly living alone: "Let us make sure that no one feels alone on this day," he writes. "Expecting a visit can transform those days when we think we have nothing to look forward to; from an initial encounter, a new friendship can emerge. Visiting the elderly who live alone is a work of mercy in our time!" The Church is even offering a plenary indulgence to all elderly who participate in the celebration of this day today, either in person or virtually, for themselves or the Holy Souls, as well as to all those who visit or accompany the elderly, fulfilling the usual conditions, of Communion, Confession and praying for the Pope's intentions.

From the Holy Father's reflection:

"In old age they will still bear fruit" (Ps 92:15). These words of the Psalmist are glad tidings, a true "gospel" that we can proclaim to all on this second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. They run counter to what the world thinks about this stage of life, but also to the attitude of grim resignation shown by some of us elderly people, who harbour few expectations for the future.

Many people are afraid of old age. They consider it a sort of disease with which any contact is best avoided. The elderly, they think, are none of their concern and should be set apart, perhaps in homes or places where they can be cared for, lest we have to deal with their problems. This is the mindset of the "throw-away culture". The Scriptures see things differently. A $long\ life - so\ the\ Bible\ teaches - is\ a\ blessing,\ and\ the\ elderly$ are not outcasts to be shunned but living signs of the goodness of God who bestows life in abundance. Blessed is the house where an older person lives! Blessed is the family that honours

Dear grandparents, dear elderly persons, we are called to be artisans of the revolution of tenderness in our world! Let us do so by learning to make ever more frequent and better use of the most valuable instrument at our disposal and, indeed, the one best suited to our age: prayer. Let us too become, as it were, poets of prayer. Our trustful prayer can do a great deal: it can accompany the cry of pain of those who suffer, and it can help change hearts. We can be the enduring chorus of a great spiritual sanctuary, where prayers of supplication and songs of praise sustain the community that toils and struggles in the field of life.

FURTHER EXTRACT FROM POPE FRANCIS' MESSAGE:

We [the elderly] ought to take care of ourselves and remain active in our later years. This is also true from a spiritual standpoint: we ought to cultivate our interior life through the assiduous reading of the word of God, daily prayer, reception of the sacraments and participation in the liturgy. In addition to our relationship with God, we should also cultivate our relationships with others: first of all by showing affectionate concern for our families, our children and grandchildren, but also for the poor and those who suffer, by drawing near to them with practical assistance and our prayers. These things will help us not to feel like mere bystanders, sitting on our porches or looking out from our windows, as life goes on all around us. Instead, we should learn to discern everywhere the presence of the Lord. Like "green olive trees in the house of God" (cf. Ps 52:10), we can become a blessing for those who live next to us. Old age is no time to give up and lower the sails, but a season of enduring fruitfulness: a new mission awaits us and bids us look to the future. The special sensibility that those of us who are elderly have for the concerns, thoughts and the affections that make us human should once again become the vocation of many. It would be a sign of our love for the younger generations. This would be our own contribution to the revolution of tenderness, a spiritual and non-violent revolution in which I encourage you, dear grandparents and elderly persons, to take an active role.

PARISH FIRE MARSHALL TRAINING – Those who have formerly been Covid Stewards among other relevant church volunteers are invited to attend Fire Marshall training on Thursday the 28th July between 7.00 to 9.00 pm so that the parish can appoint Fire Marshall for each weekend Mass. (The skills to be learnt are entirely transferable to different weekend Masses as the same procedures will be followed at all Masses.) This will take place in the church of St Vincent de Paul, 2 Witham Road, Osterley, TW7 4AJ . BAPTISM – It is possible to apply for infant baptism currently either with the form from the board at the back of church, the Parish Office or via the parish website. The next Baptism Preparation Course for those seeking their first baptism for a baby or infant is on 6th and 13th September in the church and St Edward's Room.
