Every year on the Fifth Sunday of Lent we priests are asked

Fr. Michael writes:

very charmingly by children after Mass, usually keenly supported by their parents also hoping for an easy answer, why it is the church's statues are veiled in sombre purple. The origins of this tradition are, if not lost in the mists of time, certainly obscure. One professor of the history of liturgy cites a 9th century German custom of extending a large cloth across the church's sanctuary effectively veiling the altar from the congregation. This cloth was intriguingly called the 'hungertuch', or 'hunger cloth', as its effect was to induce a hunger in the faithful as they yearned to satisfy their hunger for seeing Mass again at Easter. By the Middle Ages the crucifixes and statues were certainly individually covered, one spiritual interpretation being that as the Lord's divinity was veiled in His Passion, so His saints, too, normally triumphant in their witnessing to Him, would wish their victory in Him also to be veiled. Whatever the specific origins of the practice, what is clear is that it has helped us, millions of us as His disciples, to enter more deeply into His suffering over many centuries. We come into church and we know things are not normal. We miss our saints, Our Blessed Mother, the Sacred Heart; we are disturbed by their being veiled. That sense of separation can be useful to us, reminding us of how we can separate ourselves from them, each other and even ourselves, as all sin results is an alienation, an isolation, including a self-alienation from our truer selves and our destiny in God, a self-isolation which is truly woeful. With our spiritual companions veiled, we are helped in a different way to focus. It is not so much that they are put aside but that our focus is in participating, at however great a distance, in what Our Lord undertook for love of us, we walk with Jesus in His suffering and death, together with, for instance, St Simon of Cyrene or St Veronica and all other disciples through history. This spiritual practice bears fruit just as much as sin's grim harvest mentioned above. By our repentance and penance, by our conforming ourselves to Jesus as He invites us to, and by entering into His company spiritually, prayerfully, imaginatively, a miracle of grace occurs: we can bring Him *now* as much consolation as He received then, from Simon and Veronica, and from the other disciples close to Him through those terrible events. This realisation, with prayer bearing fruit in love, should also lead us to be a Simon or a Veronica to Him now in the least of His brothers and sisters today, and in whom He continues to walk the way of Calvary.
