Fr Michael writes:

At his General Audience in Rome last Wednesday, remarkably just before the launch of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Pope Francis appealed to believers and non-believers, to all people of goodwill, in the following words:

My heart aches greatly at the worsening situation in Ukraine. Despite the diplomatic efforts of the last few weeks, increasingly alarming scenarios are opening up. Like me, many people all over the world are feeling anguish and concern. Once again the peace of all is threatened by partisan interests. I would like to appeal to those with political responsibility to examine their consciences seriously before God, who is the God of peace and not of war; who is the Father of all, not just of some, who wants us to be brothers and not enemies. I pray that all the parties involved refrain from any action that would cause even more suffering to the people, destabilising coexistence between nations and bringing international law into disrepute.

And now I would like to appeal to everyone, believers and non-believers alike. Jesus taught us that the diabolical senselessness of violence is answered with God's weapons, with prayer and fasting. I invite everyone to make next 2nd March, Ash Wednesday, a Day of Fasting for Peace. I encourage believers in a special way to dedicate themselves intensely to prayer and fasting on that day. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war.

Given the strength of the Holy Father's words in phrases like "the diabolical senselessness of violence" and "the madness of war" it is not surprising that he followed up his Wednesday appeal with, on Friday, thus the day after the launch of the invasion, breaching diplomatic protocol: rather than summoning the Russian Ambassador to the Holy See to see the Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Parolin (as the Russian Ambassador to the United Kingdom was summoned on Thursday to the Foreign and Commonwealth Office to see our Foreign Secretary) the Pope turned up in person at the Russian Embassy asking to see the Russian Ambassador. They spent over thirty minutes together, the Vatican Press Office reported. It is to be hoped that the Ambassador will faithfully convey the Pope's thoughts to President Putin. In the meantime it is for us to pray "intensely" as the Holy Father asks and certainly observe Ash Wednesday this coming week with "God's weapons" of fasting and prayer, though fasting only for those who will not be at risk from doing so. As Cardinal Vincent writes in his Pastoral Letter to us this weekend: "No more war, no more violence!"

ASH WEDNESDAY and LENT

A) ASH WEDNESDAY MASSES: 10.00am, 12.30pm, & 7.30pm – marks the beginning of Lent and although not a Holy Day of Obligation it is a day of fasting and abstinence, requiring us to abstain from meat, and eat no more than one meal and two small collations, unless elderly or vulnerable. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at all Masses, and imposed, as by tradition, in the form of a cross on the forehead. Alternatively you may ask the priest to spinkle ashes over your head or simply remain in your place. The older children from St. Mary's School will be attending 10.00am Mass with reserved seating but there will still be plenty of space for parishioners. All Masses are simple said Masses but will be longer than normal because of the imposition of ashes. Pope Francis has designated Ash Wednesay as a universal day of Prayer and Fasting for Peace in Ukraine.

B) WEEKLY SPIRITUAL EXERCISES FOR LENT:

<u>TUESDAYS</u> 6.30pm to 7.30pm: 'ENCOUNTERING THE SPIRIT' – a small group prayer experience based on the spiritual listening and speaking learned from the synodal process. Each week we will reflect together on the previous Sunday's Gospel and how to put it into practice. The first meeting is next Tuesday 8th March in the St Edward's Room on the theme of 'Wilderness & Temptation'.

<u>WEDNESDAYS</u> after Mass from 10.30am to 12.00 noon: EXPOSITION and BENEDICTION. The Rosary will follow 10.00am Mass as usual but in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Perhaps leave and return; perhaps just drop in for extra prayer. Benediction will be at 12.00 noon.

FRIDAYS 6.00pm: STATIONS OF THE CROSS. Following the Angelus at 6.00pm, there will be a liturgical celebration of the Stations of the Cross. Those present may process behind the priest around the church at the Stations or remain in pews as preferred. (There will be no 6.00pm Mass in the PIME Convent during Lent.)

C) LENT PROJECT 2022:

As from before the pandemic, we'll have a dual Lent Project, one domestic and one overseas.

The CARDINAL'S APPEAL is our domestic project and this year the appeal will fund parish social outreach projects and Caritas Westminster (celebrating this year its 10th year of foundation) social outreach projects. For what it does and which projects are supported see: https://www.caritaswestminster.org.uk/ There are specific Cardinal's Appeal envelopes at the exits of the church.

<u>COMBONI-150</u> is our overseas project, clelebrating also the 150th anniversary of foundation of the Comboni Missionaries. All funds given through the parish will go directly to Comboni social outreach projects overseas often in areas of tension and conflict such as a clinic and school on the Ugandan border supporting refugees from South Sudan; and schools in Congo and Sri Lanka.

CASH placed in the Lent Project money box at the main doors of the church will be divided 65% for Comboni-150 and 35% Cardinal's Appeal. Cash placed in envelopes maked for either charity and handed into the collection or the presbytery will go 100% to the named charity. Cheques should be payable to 'Our Lady of Grace and St Edward's Church' and come in an envelope marked with the designated charity. Undesignated cheques will be divided as per the cash in the Lent Project box.

FOODBANK COLLECTION THIS COMING WEEK – Between this weekend and next we will have our monthly collection of non-perishable items of food which may be brought to the presbytery door. Cash donations are welcome in envelopes marked 'Foodbank' through the letterbox and there will also be a collection after each Mass next weekend.
