Fr Michael writes:

'The Church was made manifest to the world on the day of Pentecost by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, ' declares the Catechism and hence, less formally, we think of Pentecost Sunday as the 'Church's birthday' and gladly celebrate it each recurring year. It's also the birthday of that religious Order in the Church with whom the parish has now had, with Bishop John Mbinda, Fr Erasmus and Fr Femi, over a year's fruitful association – the Spiritan Order, or, more formally, the 'Congregation of the Holy Spirit under the protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary'. The Order was founded in Paris on Pentecost Sunday 1703, meaning that today is their 320th Birthday- a lot of candles for the cake! We wish them many happy returns! It's all the more fitting, therefore, that we have Fr Femi CSSp (the initials of the Order are from the Latin, Congregatio Sancti Spiritus), who has been here since the beginning of February, with us for Pentecost and that we thank him for his ministry among us. On Tuesday he'll be moving on to his next assignment in the UK which is to assist with the work of the Spiritan House at Carfin, Scotland's National Marian Shrine. For this reason, and the fact that his Order is so closely associated with the Immaculate Heart of Mary as well as the Holy Spirit, Fr Femi's last Mass in the parish will be tomorrow's Mass, Monday, on the Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church. It was Pope Francis who instituted this Marian Feast as recently as 2018 with the view that having celebrated the Church's birthday on Pentecost Sunday, we should recognise and celebrate the fact that Mary, as the Lord's Mother, is thereby also the Church's Mother. The Pope's decree establishing the Feast seeks to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the Church in the pastors, religious and faithful.." This maternal sense of the nascent Church we see very clearly in the passage of the Acts of the Apostles which closely precedes today's First Reading: *They* went to the upper room where they were staying: there were Peter and John, James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Jude son of James. With one heart all these joined in continuous prayer, together with some women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers (Acts 1:13-14). The last of the Apostles mentioned is St Jude, the patron saint of hopeless cases. Whether we are a parish of hopeless cases might be the subject for an entertaining discussion (!) but what is not in dispute is that next weekend we'll be welcoming our new Spiritan Assistant Priest, Fr Jude Duruaku CSSp. I hope you will join me giving him a very warm welcome even as we wish Fr Femi a fond farewell and the assurance of our prayers for the future.
