Fr Daniel writes:

For the next few weeks, the second reading at Mass on Sunday will be taken from the 1st Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians. Therefore, this week I'm writing a few words that will help us understand better the struggles of the Christian Community in Corinth and the response that Paul gives them.

The ancient city of Corinth was destroyed by the Romans and then rebuilt in 44BC by Julius Cesar. Corinth then became the capital of the Province of Achaia, which together with its strategic position, made it a very attractive city, especially for those who were searching for new opportunities: Jews expelled from Rome, merchants, but also a fair number of slaves who had earned their freedom and were now looking for a place in society. Corinth was a very diverse and prosperous city, but also one driven by ambition and renowned for being a place for a lot of sexual immorality.

Paul arrived at Corinth around the year 51 AD. He stayed at the house of Pricilla and Aguila and worked with them for eighteen months. He had little success with the Jews living there, but the Pagans welcomed him but in hindsight, not all did it for good reasons. Paul then left for Ephesus, while Apollos remained there preaching the Gospel. Soon the problems started. The same divisions, ambition and immorality that plagued the city of Corinth had crept into the young Christian community.

The first divisions appeared between those who recognised Paul as their spiritual father and those who preferred Apollos because he was more eloquent. Then came the disagreements between those of Jewish origin and those who had converted from Pagan practices. The rich were starting to treat the Mass as a party neglecting their poorer brethren. Some brothers were taking others to public courts to solve their issues. And to make matters worse, some found in Christianity an excuse to continue their immoral practices. Some, for example, continued offering sacrifices to idols (specially at social events), others frequented prostitutes, but there was even the case of one of the brothers who was sleeping with his mother-in-law. A real mess!

The First Letter to the Corinthians allows us to see all these problems but more importantly the solution that Paul presents. Namely, creating a stronger bond between the brothers and sisters based on the love of God manifested in the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ, and, at the same time, encouraging them to abandon the ties and the mentality of world outside. Only then, the Church could pass from mirroring the problems of society to becoming the solution to them.

Interestingly, the many difficulties that the Church still faces are not very different from those at Corinth. Therefore, we should not read this letter as a mere historical text but as a prophetic word from God to the Church of today.

HOLY WATER AND SIGN OF PEACE RETURN – The Bishops' Conference have issued new guidance for churches which have been agreed with Public Heath officals and current regulations for England. Holy Water has returned to the Holy Water stoops and the tactile Sign of Peace may be restored. The scientific consensus is that the main viral transmission is via personal oral or nasal aerosol, and thus facemasks in churches are still beneficial.

They are therefore celebrating internationally whilst also raising the profile of the current need for the continuation and development of the missionary imperative they have lived so generously over 150 years. Various celebratory events are planned for London and Chiswick including a Mass and Reception on a Thames cruiser emulating the journey of the first Sisters accompanied by the then Fr Daniel Comboni up the River Nile to the interior of Africa. Firstly, however, the jubilee year will be launched in the parish on Sunday 6th Feb when we will hear a word from one of the Sisters after all Masses. The Comboni magazine will be distributed afterwards.
