THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

Fr Michael writes:

No less than last Sunday when the Fourth Sunday of Advent in the daytime became Christmas Eve as the sun set, so we have a near conflation of great Feasts today. In Sunday's daylight hours we'll be celebrating the Feast of the Holy Family but the 6.30pm Mass will be the Vigil Mass of the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, principally celebrated on Monday 1st January, with Mass here at 12.00 noon. So a plethora of rich reflection is called for but with such limited space. However, 31st December is also the first anniversary of the death of His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI, whom we again, as we do with all our deceased, commend to Almighty God. He reflected on today's Feast as follows in 2009 and even commends us to the Mother of God at the end of his rich and powerful meditation:

Today is Holy Family Sunday. The first witnesses of Christ's birth, the shepherds, found themselves not only before the Infant Jesus but also before a small family: mother, father and new-born son. God had chosen to reveal himself by being born into a human family and the human family, thus, became an icon of God! God is the Trinity, he is a communion of love; so is the family, despite all the differences that exist between the Mystery of God and his human creature, an expression that reflects the unfathomable Mystery of God as Love. In marriage the man and the woman, created in God's image, become "one flesh" (Gen 2: 24), that is a communion of love that generates new life. The human family, in a certain sense, is an icon of the Trinity because of its interpersonal love and the fruitfulness of this love.

The Christian family is aware that children are a gift and a project of God. Therefore, it cannot consider that it possesses them; rather, in serving God's plan, through them, the family is called to educate them in the greatest freedom, which is precisely that of saying "yes" to God in order to do his will. The Virgin Mary is the perfect example of this "yes". Let us entrust all families to her.

I ask God that in your homes you may always breathe this love of total self-giving and faithfulness which Jesus brought to the world with his birth, nurturing and strengthening it with daily prayer, the constant practice of the virtues, reciprocal understanding and mutual respect. I then encourage all families so that, trusting in the motherly intercession of Mary Most Holy, Queen of Families, and under the powerful protection of St Joseph, her spouse, you may dedicate yourselves tirelessly to this beautiful mission which the Lord has placed in your hands.

CHURCH CHRISTMAS TREE - You are invited to place the names of your deceased relatives and friends whom you would like to remember during these days of Christmas to Epiphany, or any other prayer intention, on the Christmas tree at St Edward's Chapel.

CRIB OFFERINGS - The Crib Offerings by custom will go to the Westminster Catholic Children's Society to help disadvantaged children and families locally. This will help provide mental health services, family support and emergency grants for vulnerable children in our Diocese. Offerings can be made in the Crib Offering marked candle safe beside the crib under the statue of St Peter. Offerings for the candles at the crib should also be placed in the Crib Offerings boxes. Thus far over Christmas **£584.06 has been raised**. The Crib will remain up (and the offerings going to the Westminster Catholic Children's Society) until 2nd February, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. Other Christmas decorations will come down after the weekend of the Solemnity of the Epiphany – when the Three Kings will only just have arrived in the Crib!

CAROL SERVICE COLLECTION – Thank you to those who attended last Sunday's Carol Service and contributed to the retiring collection for **Medecins Sans Frontieres.** £450.58 was raised and a cheque has been sent to help them continue in their work, with a further £40 coming in from St Dunstan parishioners, and **thus a new toal of £490.58**. Either the whole of the card or just the picture half can be given in and then over the year they can be turned into the prayer cards used next Christmas on the Christmas tree, through the kind labours of volunteers. The prayer cards on the tree enable parishioners and visitors to the church to remember their loved ones and commend them to God and/or bring their intentions to Jesus, Mary and Joseph at the crib.</u>

PRIMARY SCHOOL APPLICATIONS 2024. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP), if your Catholic practice allows for it, you should firstly contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (which can also be sent electronically). You should secondly complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Canon Michael. You should not bring blank CCPs from schools. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. The period of churches being closed is irrelevant because Catholic practice is to be evidenced over several years. It is also perfectly feasible to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. The application would be categorised according to the admission criteria published by the school. Please do not phone or email the Parish Office for a slot until after it re-opens on 2nd Jan '24.
