Fr Michael writes:

Today as I write this on Saturday for the weekend it is the 50th Anniversary of the death of J.R.R. Tolkien, having died on 2nd September 1973, aged 81, may he rest in peace. His immense stature as an author both at home and abroad -TheHobbit and The Lord of the Rings having been translated into about 40 languages - is impressively recognised this year by the Royal Mint issuing a commemorative £2 coin. With the King's Head on the front, the coin has Tolkien's monograph on the reverse surrounded by a runic pattern. Around the edge of the coin is a line from Tolkien's poem The Riddle of Strider from The Fellowship of the Ring, the first volume of the trilogy: 'Not all those who wander are lost'. In its context, in a letter from Gandalf to Frodo, it's a reference to the wandering Aragorn but it points very much to his destiny, so it's very definitely a truth which applies to each of us, too, as, going onwards through life, we discern sometimes less clearly and sometimes more, the call and destiny we have in Christ. Even in this Sunday's passage from the Gospel, Peter indeed, 'wanders' a little in remonstrating with Jesus before steadying himself again, readying himself again in the light of the Lord's words, just as the protagonists of the Fellowship of the Ring must do to ensure as best they can that the struggle together ahead for the mission will be fulfilled. That The Lord of the Rings is a profoundly Christian and particularly Catholic work, is explicit in Tolkien's letters: "The Lord of the Rings is of course a fundamentally religious and Catholic work; unconsciously at first, but consciously in the revision. That is why I have not put in, or have cut out, practically all references to anything like 'religion', to cults or practices in the imaginary world. For the religious element is absorbed into the story and the symbolism." I look forward to exploring this with a new book which I have just ordered: Tolkien's Faith: A Spiritual Biography by Holly Ordway and perhaps sharing more with parishioners who are interested. I was intrigued in the publicity material of the book to learn that two of Tolkien's favourite saints were, as might be expected from so great an intellectual, St Thomas More, a great intellectual of his time also and martyr; but extraordinarily to me, St Bernadette Soubirous, the fourteen year old illiterate peasant girl of Lourdes graced with the eighteen apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the grotto of Massabielle in 1858. I had never thought the apparitions at Lourdes which lit the way ahead for Bernadette and so many millions of pilgrims after her, might also have been the inspiration for luminous encounters through the darkness of the struggle for victory in the Middle Earth of *The Lord of the Rings*.

The course is open to parishioners' children living within the parish boundaries of Chiswick, Gunnersbury and Grove Park, and who regularly attend Mass. Exceptionally, others with good reason may apply but those will need permission of their respective Parish Priests.

SCHOOL APPLICATIONS, SECONDARY AND PRIMARY, 2023. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP), if your Catholic practice allows for it, you should firstly contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (which can also be sent electronically). You should **secondly** complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Canon Michael. You should not bring blank CCPs from schools. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. The period of churches being closed is irrelevant because Catholic practice is to be evidenced over several years. It is also *perfectly feasible* to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. The application would be categorised according to the admission criteria published by the school. Phone or email the office for a 10-minute slot which will be scheduled weekly here. The first availability: Weds 13th Sept & Thurs 14th Sept 3.00-5.30pm.

A PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LISIEUX in the 150th Anniversary of the Birth of St Thérèse - What about combining the delights of autumn in Normandy and immersion into the life, spirituality and 'Little Way' of St Thérèse of Lisieux? The four night and five day trip will allow for one full day visiting the places associated with St Thérèse in Lisieux itself, including the Carmelite Convent in which she lived and died in her vocation; then a day in Alençon and environs, the place of her birth and childhood; and finally a day on a thousand years of Norman and British history in a trip to include Falaise Castle, birthplace of William the Conqueror, and the historic city of Bayeux, with Cathedral, Museum including the 'Bayeux Tapestry', returning to Lisieux via Gold Beach, the central of five heroic landings on D Day 1944. From 16th to 20th October 2023, we travel from and to Chiswick by de luxe minibus via Eurotunnel. We stay in the Grand Hôtel de l'Espérance (3*). Based on fifteen pilgrims (and a stable currency exchange and other costs), single occupancy will be £740; double occupancy just £601 per person, excluding lunches, entrance fees and personal expenses. If interested, please contact the Parish Office. With the parish organizing the trip, pilgrims MUST have personal travel insurance and sign a waiver of liability and assumption of risk. Any monies paid cannot be refunded unless a substitute pilgrim takes the place of any cancellation if a waiting list develops. Just THREE places left!
