Tomas wrítes:-

Why not me, Lord? Once Peter, John, and James came back from the Mountain of Transfiguration we hear about in today's Gospel, any of the remaining apostles may have asked this question. The event became a meeting place of the Old and New Covenant: Moses represented the law, Elijah the prophets, the three apostles were chosen to represent the new community of the followers of Jesus. And they witnessed something extraordinary: a moment of truth, a revelation of the glory of God, the radiant Lord. Peter, James, and John were offered a vision of glory in order to sustain them in the suffering to come (although in the end, only John was strong enough to come to Golgotha). As St (ST Thomas Aquinas emphasises 3.45.2), the Transfiguration was a moment of utter clarity. So would it hurt to have invited more apostles? Why did everybody else have to miss this miraculous experience of foretaste of our Lord's heavenly glory?

The Eastern Church explains that these three apostles were better prepared for the event and Jesus was able to penetrate their hearts and recognise their spirituality. The three apostles also represented the extremes of the Twelve: John was the youngest one, Peter the eldest. James was as the first apostle beheaded (by King Herod Agrippa I), John lived the longest and was the only apostle to die peacefully. But there is another explanation: the Church is a complex structure, a body – and each of us is a part of it (1 Corinthians 12:27). Each apostle was unique, and each of us, as a part of the body of Christ, His Church, has an individual role - which also means that some life experiences are available for some and not for others. An eye cannot hear and a mouth cannot see. A mother remains a mother and a father remains a father. Each of us is special, each of us has her or his unrepeatable place in God's plan for mankind. Not everybody is called to marriage, and not everybody can get married. Not everybody can get ordained, and not everybody is allowed to approach Holy Communion. Not all spiritual gifts are granted to everybody. And, as we have seen, even in Jesus's inner circle, some encounters were accessible only to some.

Therefore, as we prepare for the incomprehensible Paschal mystery, let us take a step back to find *one's singular place in God's masterplan*, remembering with St Irenaeus that *'the glory of God is a human being fully alive.'* For the Lord shows a glimpse of heavenly glory to *each* of us – at the right time, in a particular way. As he did on Mount Tabor to Peter, John, and James.
