Tomas writes:

"Do not cast me off in the time of old age, forsake me not when my strength is spent," writes the Psalmist (71:9). Day by day, the faith of countless Catholics is continually nurtured, encouraged and informed by the personal example and the loving ministry of those men who are called to serve Christ as priests in the Church. This Sunday, the Collection for the Sick and Retired Clergy takes place. It is a suitable opportunity for a reflection on the life and contribution of those who dedicated their lives to public ministry. We are being reminded that we need to value highly the commitment of faithful clergy, express our indebtedness, and provide our steadfast support to those who, even in retirement, often exercise continuing ministry. The Church sees a continuing interest in vocations but also faces a steady increase in clergy who are moving to retirement or are forced into retirement by illness.

A couple of years ago, Pope Francis met elderly priests from northern Italy. He stressed that they remained a great source of wisdom, experience, and inspiration. The Holy Father called retired clergy the bearers of dreams, full of memory. Elsewhere, he spoke of them as the shrines of holiness. Indeed, many of them know very well that genuine spiritual insight is not a fruit of dry learning but rather of life experience. Countless old priests remain active protagonists in their communities. Their sacramental priesthood is truly a gift for the community and comes from Christ Himself, from the fullness of His own priesthood; the retirement does not variate this gift. Accordingly, many retired priests, when they step down from active ministry, help their fellow priests, allowing them to take the well-deserved time off, and at other times when they are needed. But not everybody is able to serve until the last breath. Many elderly priests are poorly and do need help. In his address, Pope Francis also said that aging could be viewed as a privilege because they have the chance to experience the suffering of Our Lord. "You are experiencing a season, old age, which is not a disease but a privilege, and even those of you who are sick live, we can say, a privilege: that of resembling Jesus who suffers, carrying the Cross like Him. Indeed – we just need to think of Simeon and Anna: just when they are elderly, the Gospel enters fully into their lives and, taking Jesus in their arms, they announce to everyone the revolution of tenderness." But in those challenging and difficult moments, our elderly priests need our help. By giving to the Sick and Retired Priests Fund, you can help that they are taken care for after decades of service to God and their parishioners, recognising their lasting desire for self-gift that motivated their priestly call many years ago."And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up. So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." (Galatians 6:9-10).

PUBLIC CONSULTATION on Cycleway 9, Chiswick High Road, Citing documentation sent from the Council: Hounslow Council has launched the construction of phase 3b of Cycleway 9 (C9), between Chiswick Lane and Heathfield Terrace. Construction is outlined for completion in mid December, subject to change depending on material availability and other logistical challenges. On Tuesday 4th October Transport for London (TfL) launched their six month public consultation surrounding the updates to the cycleway. This consultation forms an important part of the Experimental Traffic Order review process, where the feedback received, alongside monitoring data, will be used to inform the future of Cycleway 9 on Chiswick High Road. The consultation will be live until Tuesday 4th April, up until which time individuals are invited to submit as many responses as they see fit.
