# THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

### Fr Michael writes:

Today's Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord celebrates life; life to the fullest, here and hereafter. As we heard over some of the Christmas Masses, *Preface III of the Nativity* so eloquently expresses this truth:

For through him the holy exchange that restores our life has shone forth today in splendour: when our frailty is assumed by your Word not only does human mortality receive unending honour but by this wondrous union we, too, are made eternal.

Our mortal nature in itself leads only to death but with the Son of God in his divine nature assuming this very mortal nature we, too, may through the Holy Spirit share in his divine nature. Our baptism is our being grafted into this divine nature just as today's Gospel of the Lord's baptism by St John in the River Jordan, is the Lord's wholly identifying with our fallen human nature in need of redemption, though he is without sin. Given our expertise in life, human and divine, it follows then that we Christians are to be apostles of life and defenders of life. "*Woe to you if you do not succeed in defending life!*" as Pope St John Paul II declared at World Youth Day in Denver USA in 1993.

### House of Commons Health and Social Care Committee Inquiry into Assisted Suicide ('Assisted Dying')

The above Committee of the Commons launched this inquiry shortly before Christmas, inviting responses from the public, but without leaving much time for that response, namely by 20<sup>th</sup> January. I do encourage parishioners, particularly healthcare and legal professionals to respond from their expertise but also all others interested, to look it up online either by entering the full title above into a search engine or following the link: https://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/M66AML/ The online form is just of six questions and the Chair of the Committee, Mr Steve Brine MP, writes that "We want to hear from campaigners, members of the medical profession and members of the public". Following the inquiry and the consideration of the evidence gathered, the MPs will write a report for the Government about prospective next steps. It is these next steps which are the worry given the profound dangers to public safety and the common good which assisted suicide could present. The Church's unfailingly held determination, of course, is that we can never assist in taking the life of another, even if they request it; that life is sacred from conception to natural death. High quality palliative care is what is required in such situations; assistance in living, not assistance in suicide.

POST- EASTER HOLIDAY PILGRIMAGE TO THE LOIRE? - The parish is planning a small group six-day coach trip 17th - 22nd April 2023 to the shrines and wines of the Loire. Based in the ancient Catholic city of Tours we'll visit the shrine of St Martin before further day trips to the medieval city and Cathedral of Orléans frequented by St Joan of Arc during the Siege of Orléans (which, against the English, she won...); also the Royal Abbey of Fontevraud, a World Heritage Site, where, among others, King Henry II of England and his son, King Richard the Lionheart, are buried; also the great Abbaye Saint-Pierre de Solesmes, a vast living monastery with over 1,000 years of history as well as being custodian and promoter of Gregorian chant. Where possible Mass will be celebrated daily at the various sites. There will also be a chance to explore a few of the vineyards of the Loire's celebrated wines. Sadly we will not have time to visit any of the Loire's famous royal chateaux. Travelling by coach and Eurotunnel, and staying in central two-star ensuite accommodation, the approximate cost, while details are still to be finalised, will be £750 excluding lunch, supper and admission charges.
