Last Wednesday Pope Francis published his Apostolic Exhortation *Laudate Deum* (Praise God) on the climate crisis. The full text can be found on the diocesan website <u>www.rcdow.org.uk</u> This is from paragrpahs 62-73:

The Bible tells us: "God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good" (Gen 1:31). His is "the earth with all that is in it" (Deut 10:14). For this reason, he tells us that, "the land shall not be sold in perpetuity, for the land is mine; with me you are but aliens and tenants" (Lev 25:23). Hence, responsibility for God's earth means that human beings, endowed with intelligence, must respect the laws of nature and the delicate equilibria existing between the creatures of this world.

At the same time, the universe as a whole, in all its manifold relationships, shows forth the inexhaustible richness of God. Hence, to be wise, we need to grasp the variety of things in their multiple relationships. Along this path of wisdom, it is not a matter of indifference to us that so many species are disappearing and that the climate crisis endangers the life of many other beings.

Jesus was able to invite others to be attentive to the beauty that there is in the world because he himself was in constant touch with nature, lending it an attraction full of fondness and wonder. As he made his way throughout the land, he often stopped to contemplate the beauty sown by his Father, and invited his disciples to perceive a divine message in things.

Hence, the creatures of this world no longer appear to us under merely natural guise because the risen One is mysteriously holding them to himself and directing them towards fullness as their end. The very flowers of the field and the birds which his human eyes contemplated and admired are now imbued with his radiant presence. If the universe unfolds in God, who fills it completely, there is a mystical meaning to be found in a leaf, in a mountain trail, in a dewdrop, in a poor person's face. The world sings of an infinite Love: how can we fail to care for it?

Journeying in communion and commitment God has united us to all his creatures. Human life is incomprehensible and unsustainable without other creatures. For as part of the universe all of us are linked by unseen bonds and together form a kind of universal family, a sublime communion which fills us with a sacred, affectionate and humble respect.

I ask everyone to accompany this pilgrimage of reconciliation with the world that is our home and to help make it more beautiful, because that commitment has to do with our personal dignity and highest values. "Praise God" is the title of this letter. For when human beings claim to take God's place, they become their own worst enemies.

SCHOOL APPLICATIONS, SECONDARY AND PRIMARY, 2023. To obtain a Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP), if your Catholic practice allows for it, you should **firstly** contact the Parish Office to request an appointment and collect a self-assessment form (which can also be sent electronically). You should secondly complete the self-assessment form and bring it to your appointment with Canon Michael. You should not bring blank CCPs from schools. If you are a Catholic but not a practising Catholic, it will be impossible to issue a CCP as it is certifying actual Catholic practice of habitually attending weekly Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. The period of churches being closed is irrelevant because Catholic practice is to be evidenced over several years. It is also *perfectly feasible* to submit an application to a Catholic school without a CCP. The application would be categorised according to the admission criteria published by the school.
