Fr. Michael writes:



"Tell us Mary, what didst thou see upon the way?" begins the ancient prayer called the Easter Sequence which we'll be reading (or singing!) in today's Easter Masses. In response to the question St Mary Magdalene replies to us, "I saw Christ's glory as he rose". Her tears mourning Jesus give way to her rejoicing in His glory as she clings to Him in the Garden of the Resurrection - itself an echo of the paradise lost in the Garden of Eden but now superabundantly restored in the Risen Lord. Mary Magdalene recognises that the glory she sees in Him as risen, is the same glory which forgave her sins, her "many sins" as the Gospel says. It is the *same glory* which drove out the devils from her; the same glory which purified her heart enabling her to become the Lord's disciple and friend; the same glory which continues to transform her now into glory, for the Risen Lord Jesus is risen precisely to enable us to participate and to share His Risen Life, the Divine Life, finally the Divine Glory. The *Catechism* of the Church calls the Resurrection "the climax of the Incarnation". Everything was forever changed by God's descent into humanity at Christmas but now that gift of the Divine Life reaches the fullness of its fruitfulness as our humanity in Christ is raised from the dead to share the Risen Life of Christ. God has given Himself utterly for the world and for each of us and, in our lives, in the Church and in the Sacraments, He continues ever to do so until we are raised up with the saints in the same glory which we too can see in the Resurrection by faith, upon our way, and which itself becomes our spiritual birthright, our vocation and our destiny.

OUR OVERSEAS LENT PROJECT THIS YEAR: St Francis Leprosy Guild (SFLG) - a Catholic charity with a 127 year history of working to end the suffering still caused by leprosy. It supports 40 leprosy centres around the world treating and supporting almost 20,000 people in low-income countries. £1418.31 has been donated so far. OUR DOMESTIC LENT PROJECT THIS YEAR: Cardinal's Lenten Appeal 2023 - Funds raised this year will be shared between the four pillars of the Cardinal's Appeal: Marriage & Family Life; Youth & Evangelisation; the Education Service and Caritas Westminster. Cardinal Nichols has expressed his gratitude to everyone who supports the Appeal. £866.54 has been donated so far. Undesignated cheques will be divided as per the cash in the Lent Project box.
