THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Fr Michael writes:

"You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you." At first glance this might seem to us something of a distant or remote thing for the voice of the Father to have said to His Son, given that what was said must surely have already been known by the Son. Clearly it expresses the very intimate relationship between Father and Son and the Father's favouring of the Son, commending Him to all those assembled by the River Jordan for St John the Baptist to baptise them. But of course the truth of the matter is that it wasn't said for Jesus' benefit but for ours. When we reflect on it and in the current context of being still so close to Christmas, we begin to see how this line of the Father's involves us so much, invites us to so much, promises us so much. On the Feast of Christmas in the manger at Bethlehem we see God *choosing human life* for Himself: here is Emmanuel, God-with-us. On this Feast of the Baptism of the Lord we see this truth the other way round: here we humanity, in the person of Jesus, a human being, being anointed to, chosen for, the Divine Life, the life of God, in God. From God choosing humanity at Christmas, now humanity, in whom God by His choice has been made one, the Second Adam after the failure of the first Adam, is here choosing obedience and so *choosing* God and Who indeed is then *anointed* by God confirming the choice both of God and renewed, that is, the new humanity.

Pope Francis developed this much further when speaking of our own baptism at a General Audience: Baptism is the Sacrament on which our very faith is founded and which grafts us as a living member onto Christ and his Church. It configures us to the Lord and turns us into a living sign of his presence and of his love. Yet a question may stir within us: is Baptism really necessary to live as Christians and follow Jesus? After all, isn't it merely a ritual, a formal act of the Church in order to give a name to the little boy or girl? This question can arise. And on this point what the Apostle Paul writes is illuminating: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom 6:3-4). Therefore, it is not a formality! It is an act that touches the depths of our existence. A baptized child and an unbaptized child are not the same. We, by Baptism, are immersed in that inexhaustible source of life which is the death of Jesus, the greatest act of love in all of history; and thanks to this love we can live a new life, no longer at the mercy of evil, of sin and of death, but in communion with God and with our brothers and sisters. We must reawaken the memory of our Baptism. We are called to live out our Baptism every day as the present reality of our lives.

Beyond that, the final session will be at 4.00pm to 5.30pm Sunday 16th January also in the Parish Centre, either the Main Hall or the Lounge Bar depending on numbers, which will be aimed at all those who *have participated* in previous sessions, and will be reflecting on the whole parish process and helping to prepare the parish submission to the diocese with any last contributions. Fr Michael and Clare Muldoon, the Parish Synodality Rep, will then write up the submission to be in by 21st January.
