Fr Jude writes:

THE MEEKNESS OF LOVE

The Serenity Prayer attributed to Reinhold Niebuhr says, "Lord grant me the courage to change the things I can; the serenity to accept the things I cannot change and the *wisdom* to know the difference". This wisdom, which is at the heart of Christian spirituality, is found in what I call the *meekness of love*. This is beautifully portrayed in the gospel passage of today from Matthew 11:25-30. This passage is so important that the Church presents it on the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, wherein we are invited into the core of Christian living fraught with so many challenges.

A careful exegesis of the original Greek words in the passage (Matthew 11:25-30) will bring out its meaning. 'Labour' (Kopiao in Greek) means "to feel fatigue; to work hard; 'Overburdened' "phortizo" in Greek means "to be filled with spiritual anxiety" or "laden with routine or ceremony"; 'yoke' ("dzogos" in Greek) means, "a beam of balance"; 'rest' ("anapawo" in Greek) means "to be refreshed". 'Meek' ("prahos" in Greek) means "gentle or lowly". The implication of this golden passage therefore is that as one embraces the challenges of life, humbly and meekly in imitation of the meek saviour, one will be "at home on this earth" in terms of managing the vicissitudes of life effectively and efficiently. This is the meaning of the meek inheriting the earth (Matthew 5:5).

Beloved, are you overburdened with the "cross of the life's daily routine and challenges?" Are you cumbered with a load of cares, fears, depression, and disappointments and disillusionment with what is happening in the globe? Come in humility to the gentle saviour and adopt the meekness of love and you will be refreshed. Just as the refresh button of a computer is pressed when it is overworked to get it restarted and working well again, the Lord will raise you by His Spirit and lift you up when you are down. He will enable you to change with courage, the situations you can, and accept serenely the ones you cannot change. The reality of things is that life is "bitter – sweet", and therefore one needs the yoke as "a beam of balance" to help one carry on.

As we begin a new liturgical week, may you draw strength from the anointing flowing from the passages of the day and may the promises encoded in them find perfect fulfillment in your life. Amen. May you be filled with the Spirit of meekness that will enable you to grapple with the challenges of life and conquer them with grace and equanimity through Christ Our Lord. Amen.
