Fr Daniel writes:

Imagine you found a magic lamp, and the genie inside granted you one wish. What would you ask for? There are so many things that we want and need, but how do we decide what is the best? Or better still, how can we ask for all these things with only one wish? Well... you might be interested to know that there is a way. If it ever occurred to you that you find a magic lamp all you need to ask the genie for is "Shalom".

The Hebrew word "Shalom" is many times translated as "Peace" but in fact it means much more than that. It means wholeness, happiness, health, wellbeing, safety, prosperity, fulfilment. It means being at peace with oneself, with the others and with God. It means having all your physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs covered. "Shalom" is everything you could ask for. The difficulty, of course is, that the chances of any of us finding a magic lamp are very thin. But, not to worry, because there is a solution to that too: We don't need the lamp! "Shalom" is what God promises to give to his people, and to us also, in the first reading today.

Because "Shalom" is such a complicated term, most of the times it is best described with images, and in the first reading today Isaiah used the image of a baby being fed by his mother. Is there anything more peaceful, anything calmer than a baby that is been suckled? He has got everything he could possibly ask for: he is satisfied, he is safe, and he is loved. Imagine what would have meant for the People of Israel to hear those words of Isaiah after 70 years in Exile, oppressed and forced to labour.

However, I am not entirely sure if they ever understood the prophecy completely. What I mean is, that lovely as it is, before the baby can enjoy the love, the comfort, the safety and the care of his mother, he has to be born. And that is hard work! Or so mothers say. And for the people of Israel, it was no different. Before they can see this prophecy fulfilled, they had to undergo a long and hard process. They need to come back to their country and start from scratch, rebuild what was destroyed, start planting their crops in lands which had not been looked after and used for a long time, and above all they need to regain the confidence in themselves and in God.

For us is not very different. Shalom belongs only to heaven. And we will enjoy it in fulness when the toil of this life has come to an end. But in the Church we have an advantage: the sacraments. Small windows through which we can receive a little of that heavenly peace while we pilgrim through life until the day when the Lord calls us back and we can enjoy the fulness of joy and peace: Shalom.

VISITING PRIESTS ON MASSES – With Fr Daniel currently on retreat in the Holy Land but following that on summer leave, Fr Michael is sole resident in the presbytery, which may well mean the door and phone is not answered outside of office hours if Fr Michael has appointments in or away from the house. It also means there will be quite a number of visiting priests to celebrate Masses both at weekends and during the week. Please make them welcome.

FR. DANIEL TO DEPART and FR DANIEL TO ARRIVE, together with FR. ERASMUS: Fr Daniel has been with us since Sept 2021 and impelled as he ever has been by a strong sense of mission (cf 2Cor 5:14) - which brought him to our diocese and parishes - he offered himself to the Cardinal for 'Missio ad gentes' to be sent further afield for the mission of the Church. He has learned that he is to go to the Diocese of Plymouth for some years. The move is scheduled for Sept 2022 so we'll have time for a Farewell Mass before his venturing west on mission. In the mean time, his successor in Chiswick has been announced also, the newly ordained Fr Daniel Daley. Fr Daniel was ordained priest on 25th June in Westminster Cathedral so let us pray for him together with the three other newly ordained priests, Fr Mike Guthrie and Fr David Cherry, both of whom have had placements in Chiswick parish, and Fr Matteo Di Giuseppe. We pray for the four newly ordained priests and give thanks to God for their future ministry. Fr Daniel Daley will move into Chiswick in September to take up his appointment. Bishop John Mbinda's Holy Ghost Father replacement has also been announced by the Spiritans & Diocese. We will look forward to welcoming Fr Erasmus Onyema Egenonu CSSp also in September and trust, if God's Will, that he might stay in the parish a little longer than his illustrious predecessor!
